Report on the Council on Legislation

To all Rotarians in District 7780:

It was my honor and privilege to serve as your delegate to the 2007 Council on Legislation of Rotary International, which met April 22 through April 28, 2007 in Chicago. At this Council, we considered 337 pieces of proposed legislation – comprised of 167 enactments, which are proposals to amend the constitutional documents of Rotary International and 170 resolutions, which do NOT seek to amend the constitutional documents.

Of the items listed above, the members of the Council adopted 59 enactments and 38 resolutions. We referred 14 pieces of proposed legislation to the Board of Directors of Rotary International for further study. We rejected 152 proposals, and 74 proposals were withdrawn or considered withdrawn. Of the total number of proposals which were adopted, we adopted 84 exactly as they had been written, while we amended and then adopted the remaining 13 proposals.

One of the proposals which effects each of us, is Enactment 07-14:

It is enacted by Rotary International that the STANDARD ROTARY CLUB
CONSTITUTION be and hereby is amended as follows (page 243 MOP)

Article 11 Duration of Membership
Section 4 Termination – Non-Attendance.

- · Attendance Percentages . A member must
- (1) attend or make up at least 50% of club regular meetings in each half of the year;

Another proposal we amended and then enacted, deals with the termination of clubs which fail to investigate an allegation that a member violated youth protection laws. The amended and approved portion reads as follows:

3.030.3 Suspension or Termination for Failure to Comply with Youth Protection Laws. The board may suspend or terminate the membership of a club that fails to appropriately address any allegations made against one of its members in connection with Rotary-related youth programs for violation of applicable law regarding the protection of youth.

We voted to encourage clubs to welcome Rotary Foundation alumni as guests at club meetings. We adopted a resolution which reduces Matching Grant minimums from \$5,000 to \$2,500. We voted to adopt Hindi as an officially recognized language of Rotary International and to include Russian as an officially supported language of Rotary International.
