## Governor Marty's Message



"Peace on Earth, Good Will To All"

We sing the words every year during the holiday season. This year they seem particularly poignant, as news from Newtown, CT, proves that an unbalanced young man with a gun can destroy so many lives. So here's the question: Do we truly believe that Peace on Earth will ever be? Do we truly believe that someday swords will actually be beaten into plowshares? It's certainly true that humans work harder and with seemingly greater passion at waging war than we do at waging peace. I guess it's been that way since the time we all lived in caves. But Rotarians not only know better, we do better. Rotarians were the impetus behind the creation of UNESCO, and we were instrumental in

bringing together the conference in San Francisco that resulted in the founding of the United Nations. The UN is far from perfect, but it is the only standing committee in the world, made up of representatives of the world's political units, designed to stop war and promote peace. Rotarians can be justly proud of our part in its formation and development. The UN is a statement of Rotary's long view. So are the myriad scholarships and opportunities to live and travel overseas that we offer young people. Rotary knows that providing international experiences -- without asking for specific return – will result in its own reward, because these young people return to live their lives more aware of their place in global society. As one former exchange student said at the Rotary Global Peace Forum in Berlin last month, she can no longer hear about civil unrest on the other side of the globe without worrying about how her friends from that country are faring. Peace, it turns out, is truly personal!

Peace is more than the cessation of war. As RI President Sakuji Tanaka said at the Peace Forum, if we spend our time trying to end war, we've already failed. We need to spend our time instead in making sure that war never happens, and that means working to avoid the things that result in war: Injustice. Poverty. Illiteracy. Disease.

By definition, children in countries that are at war are poorer, less literate, and more prey to disease than their counterparts in nations at peace. Indeed, child

So as the carols end, as the tree decorations and candles are put away, as the Holiday glow fades away, it's even more critical to remember the true message of the Season: to heal the sick and broken, to reach out to our less-fortunate neighbors, to do the work we were put here to do every day of the year.

The Holiday Season is about family and good will. I would like to convey an appropriately warm and fuzzy message

on polio, and think I can, even though it is about the latest Independent Monitoring Board report admitting that we did not reach 2012 eradication

targets.Despite program setbacks, the 6<sup>th</sup> Report of this very highly respected and very independent board is quite optimistic. It notes: All but 0.1% of polio has been eradicated globally – only 175 cases so far in 2012. Polio is now present in only 94 political subdivisions (Districts) in 4 countries. The Program is benefiting from an unprecedented level of priority and commitment, much of it stemming from the World Health Assembly declaration of polio eradication as an emergency for global public health.
