Together we brought Christmas to the small town of Lac Megantic. D7780 Rotarians made new friends in Uganda, Cambodia, India, the Dominican Republic and Guatemala.

- \* Yanira Batres, a Guatemalan educator: her story describes what the gift of literacy means to indigenous children in rural pueblos
- \* Bob Crowley, of Survivor fame: persistence and a positive attitude a story sure to inspire





