Dover Rotary Celebrates 90 Years of Service

It was quite a celebration as Dover Rotarians, family, and friends gathered to celebrate their history of service to the community! Led by President Matt Silvia, the club looked back on how it has played a major role in "the renaissance of the city." Rotary has been key in major city projects such as the Dover Riverwalk and the Henry Law Park, an annual shoe and boot program to provide needy children with appropriate footwear for school, scholarships, and visits to maintain connections with the elderly in the community. The highlight of the evening was awarding Paul Harris Fellows to Clair Bloom (founder of End 68 Hours of Hunger), Rotarian Bob O'Connell (for his contributions to RYLA), Jack Buckley (former director of Dover Housing Authority) and Don Briand (local radio personality and community volunteer).

District Grant Applications Due June 1

If you have an idea for a new service project, a district community grant could help with the funding to get it started. These grants, which are available as a direct result of our contributions to The Rotary Foundation, may be used for a variety of projects. In the past, these grants have helped clubs build local gardens and trails, support reading projects and supplemental feeding programs - and a huge variety of other projects! The purpose is to help projects that will have a positive impact on a community. Rotarian involvement is key. Projects can be done locally or internationally. The funds will be available by late summer. For more information about the grant, contact your club's Foundation Chair or look on the district website. These grants are competitive, reviewed by a screening committee of Club Foundation Chairs. Though it is expected that projects will have some club financial support, there is a special \$1000 grant for clubs with fewer than 20 members that does not require a financial commitment. Grant applications must be received (electronically) by John Atwood, our District Grants Chair, no later than June 1.
