The focus at the Conference was on the lives changed by Rotary service, but we also took time out to celebrate some individual Rotarians for the remarkable work that they have done this year and over the course of their Rotary careers.

Roger Fagan (**Portland**), was honored with the Service Above Self award for the work that he has done to provide solar-powered hearing aids in the Dominican Republic and elsewhere over the past 20 years. Roger, who is an audiologist by profession, makes annual service trips to provide the gift of hearing. Most recently, members of his club have traveled with him to provide clean water and prosthetic LN-4 hands as well.

Moreover, a special Paul Harris Fellow was awarded to Anne Marie Dagenais, of the Salvation Army in Quebec. District Rotary Foundation Service Awards were awarded to Mary Tennant (**Brunswick Coastal**) and John Atwood (**Damariscotta Newcastle**) for their outstanding service on the District Foundation Committee over the past three years, during a remarkable period of change.
