



Anne L. Matthews

Anne Matthews is vice-president-elect of Rotary International, member of the RI Board of Directors, and Past Trustee of The Rotary Foundation.

Anne, who joined Rotary back in 1989, has served as a member of the Future Vision Committee, regional Rotary Foun-



dation coordinator, and twice as Lead Seminar Trainer at the International Assembly. Anne is one of the most sought-after speakers on the Rotary circuit. She has spoken in all 50 states and Puerto Rico and 20 countries on educational issues and/or The Rotary Foundation.

Anne served as District Governor of D-7770 (eastern South Carolina) in 1999-2000. She completed a three-year term as the District's Foundation chair in 2006, and that year, District 7770 was ranked as number one in the world in Annual Giving and number seven in total giving to the Foundation. Anne has received The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award, and Rotary International's highest honor, the Service Above Self award.

Rochelle Arms



Rochelle Arms was a
Rotary Peace Fellow who
earned her MA in International Relations at the
Universidad del Salvador
in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from 2003-2005. She
is currently the Restorative
Justice Coordinator of the
New York Peace Institute.

At the Institute, Rochelle is responsible for mediation and restorative justice initiatives with the Brooklyn District Attorney's Office, Juvenile Justice Courts, schools, and community agencies in Brooklyn and Manhattan.

In the last 12 years, Rochelle has worked both in the U.S. and abroad in collaborative processes and restorative justice projects, with a variety of groups, including civil society organizations in India, indigenous peoples in Argentina, immigrants and refugees, and homicide offenders and victim survivors in Kentucky.

Rochelle chairs the International Section of the Association for Conflict Resolution, one of the largest mediator membership organizations. Today a US citizen, Rochelle is originally from Panama.

Ann Lee Hussey

Ann Lee Hussey
has shared her passion for polio eradication throughout
the Rotary world, at
District Conferences, Zone Insti-



tutes, Presidents-elect Training Seminars, and Rotary Foundation Seminars. Highlights include the RIBI (Rotary International in Britain and Ireland) Conference in 2010, International Institute in Salt Lake City in 2007, the Presidential Peace Conference in Kenya in 2007 and the International Convention in Los Angeles in 2008.

In 2005, Ann Lee received Rotary's highest honor for individual Rotarians, the Service Above Self award, and this spring, she was named a White House Champion of Change for her work. Ann Lee strongly believes that one person can make a difference and that it is a privilege and a gift to do the work of Rotary.

She and her husband Michael Nazemetz are members of the Portland Sunrise Club and Major Donors of The Rotary Foundation. Ann Lee was District Governor in 2010-11.

Tony Gilmore



Tony Gilmore, this year's District Governor of D-7870 (southern New Hampshire and southern Vermont) volunteers for Pure Water for the World as its media specialist and webmaster. He has traveled with Pure Water several times to Honduras and Haiti on humanitarian missions. He led a Group

Study Exchange team to the Philippines in 2009. Tony is a multiple Paul Harris member and a Foundation Benefactor.

His Rotary involvement has been a constant throughout his adult life. He joined the Rotary Club of Concord, NH, over 35 years ago. Career and scheduling changes took him to the clubs of Capital City Sunrise (Concord), West Springfield (MA), Sugarbush Valley (VT), and back to New Hampshire and Capital City Sunrise.

Tony and his wife Liz now live in Hopkinton, NH. Not content to sit still, Tony has started a new business, World Digital Photography, that expands on his passion for photography for non-profits.

Deborah Walters

Deb Walters found her passion with Safe Passage, the non-profit that assists the children of families who live and work on the Guatemala City dump. She was quickly enthused – and just as quickly asked to serve on the Board of Safe Passage.

Since then, she has written and coordinated many Matching Grants to



help support Safe Passage, and she has been president of the Board of Safe Passage for four years.

Deb was District Governor in 2011-12 of D-7790 (northern Maine and southern Quebec). Her home club of Unity, Maine, selected her as Club Rotarian of the Year in 2007. The next year, she and her husband Chris Percival were recognized as Paul Harris Fellows for her literacy work in Guatemala and for his considerable support of those efforts. Both are Major Donors and Rotary Benefactors.

Deb's most recent venture is to raise money for Safe Passage via a kayak/sailing trip from Maine to Guatemala.

Rachel Williams

Rachel Williams believes strongly that educational assistance is the key to peace, both locally and internationally. She believes that to keep crime down in our neighborhoods, we need good public schools, and that to maintain peace in the world, we need to promote literacy on a global basis – especially in cultures



where girls have previously not been permitted to earn an education.

In addition to her activities as a member of the Rotary Club of Ipswich, MA, Rachel has served as District Literacy Resource Coordinator in District 7930 (Boston and the North Shore).

Rachel is a passionate speaker on literacy. She spoke at Rotary/UN Day in New York City in 2011, and she is an Ambassador of Goodwill in Pakistan and last year addressed the District 3272 Peace Conference there. For her work, in 2009 she received the Service Above Self Award, Rotary's highest award for individual Rotarians.


