Shared Stories - Changed Lives

When visiting each club last fall, I spoke of the keyway within the Rotary wheel being the place to collect our Rotary stories. Just as the keyway enables a gear to engage, so too, our stories are what set the Rotary wheel in motion. This

conference, our conference, is our opportunity to share our stories and acknowledge the good that resulted because of Rotary.

This weekend, you will hear a collection of inspired stories - stories of fellow Rotarians - Rotarians from our clubs - who traveled to far-away countries to help provide clean water, an education, an opportunity to live with dignity. And then take those stories - the projects, the ideas, the inspiration - and share them - with your family when you return home, with your colleagues at work. Take a few minutes to tell a story you heard at the conference when you go to your Rotary meeting next week. Share a good Rotary story and help our wheel turn to change more lives.




