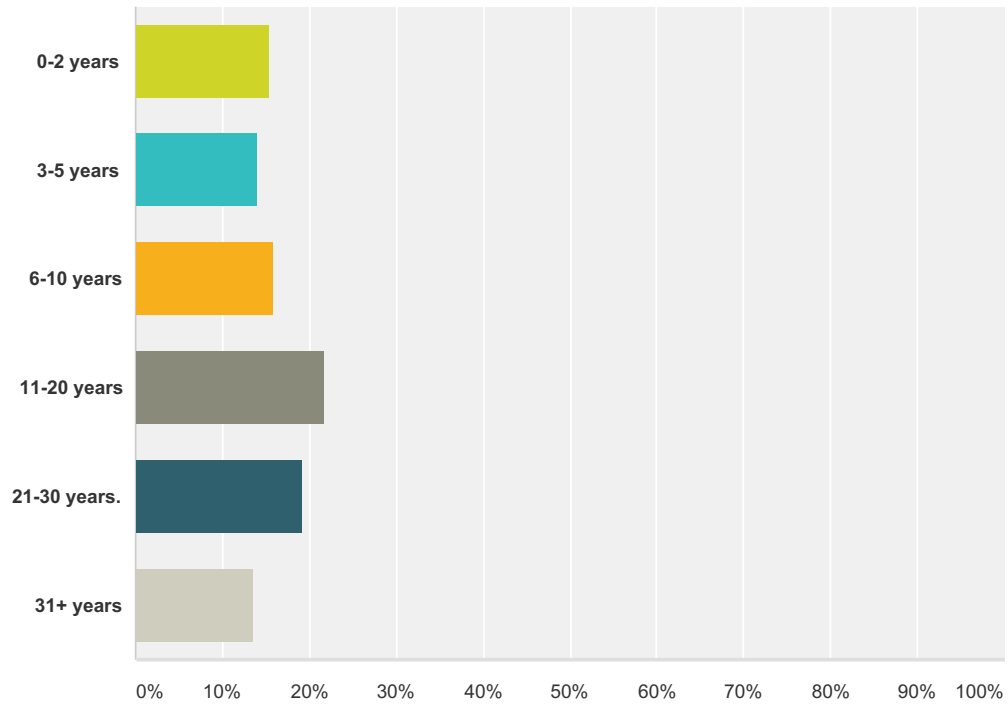

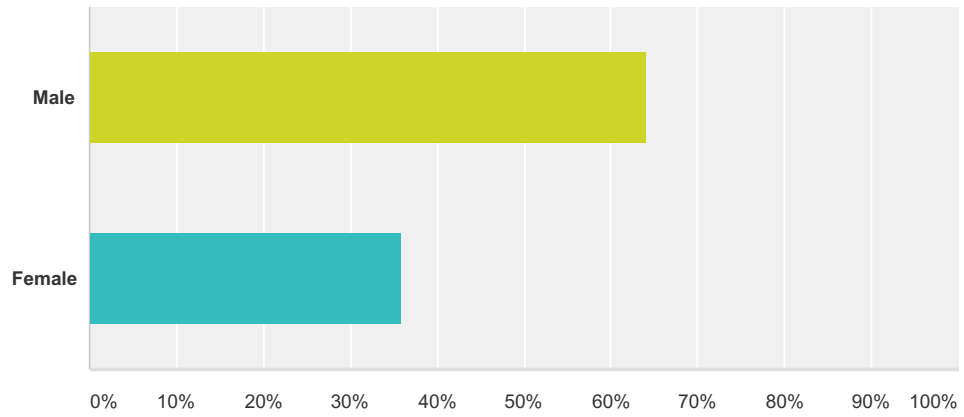

### Q2 My gender is?

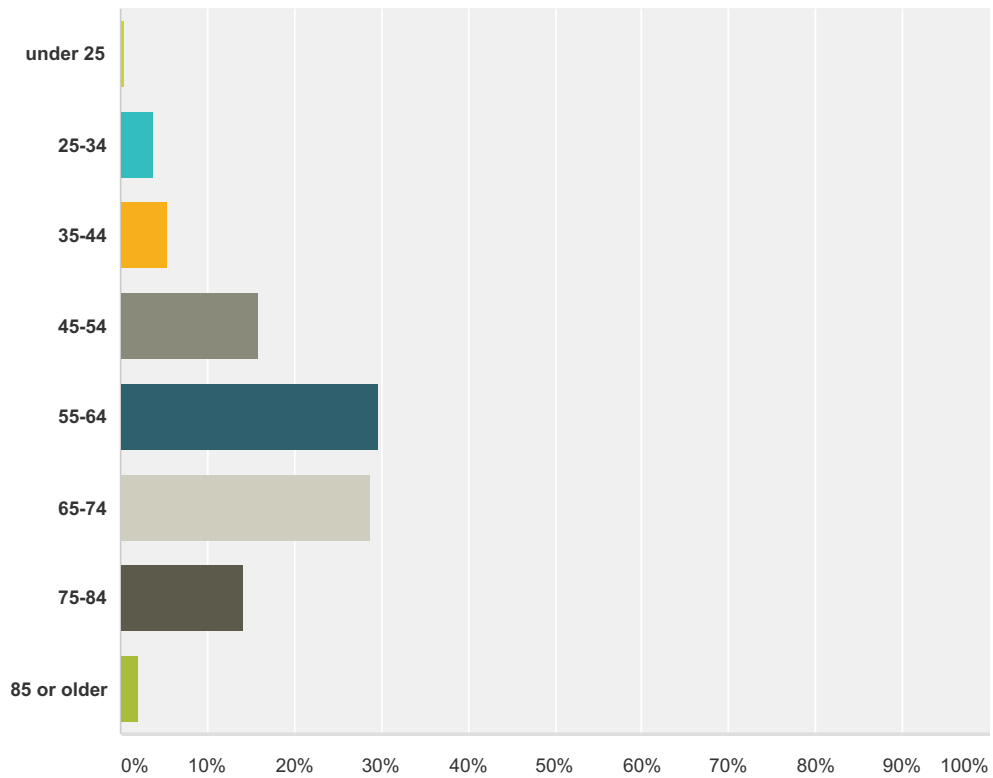

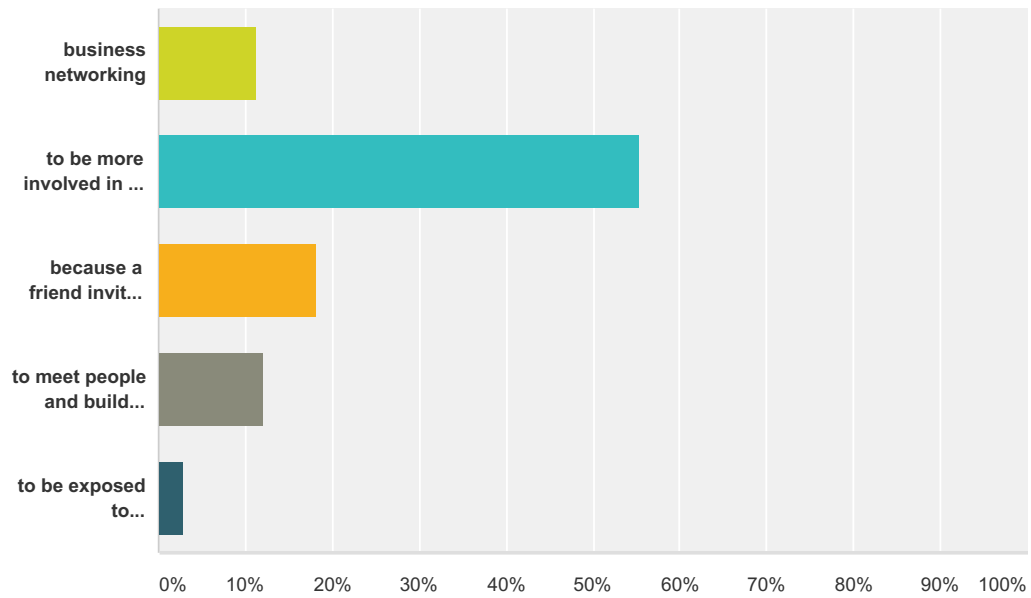

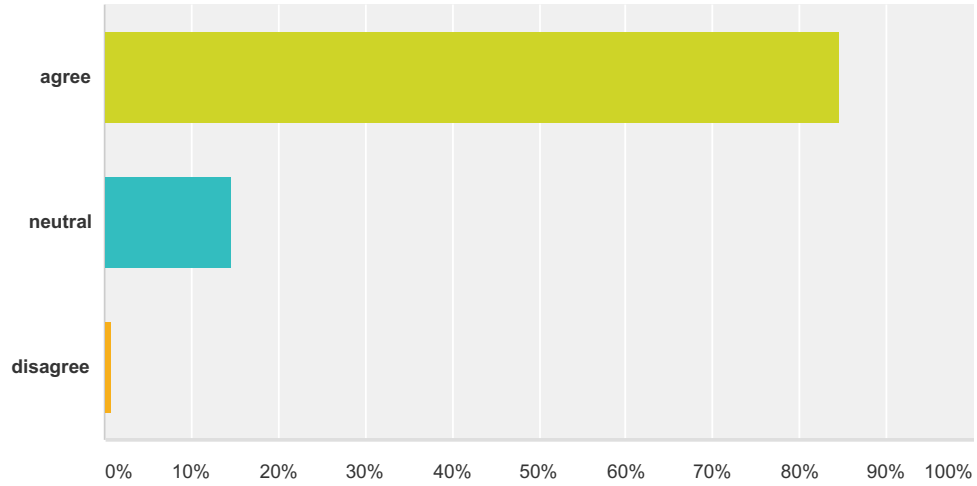

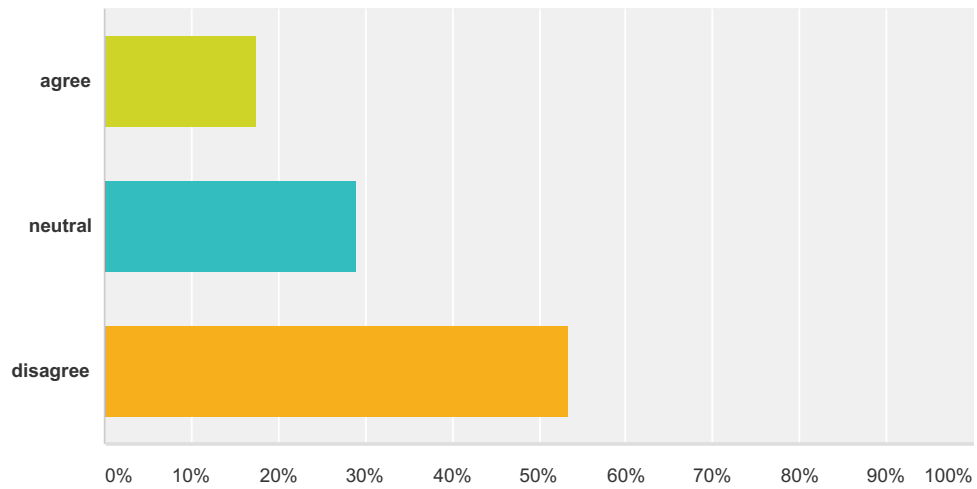

### Q6 The cost of membership has kept me from encouraging someone to join Rotary.

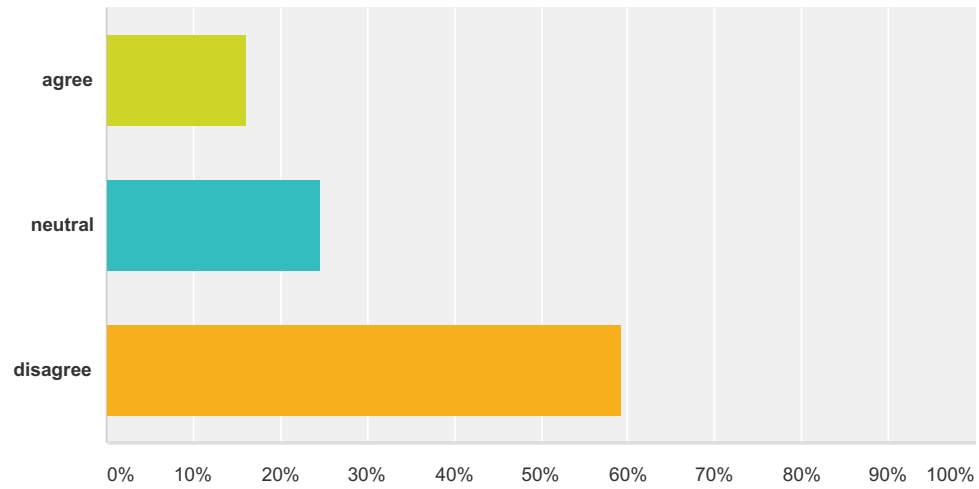

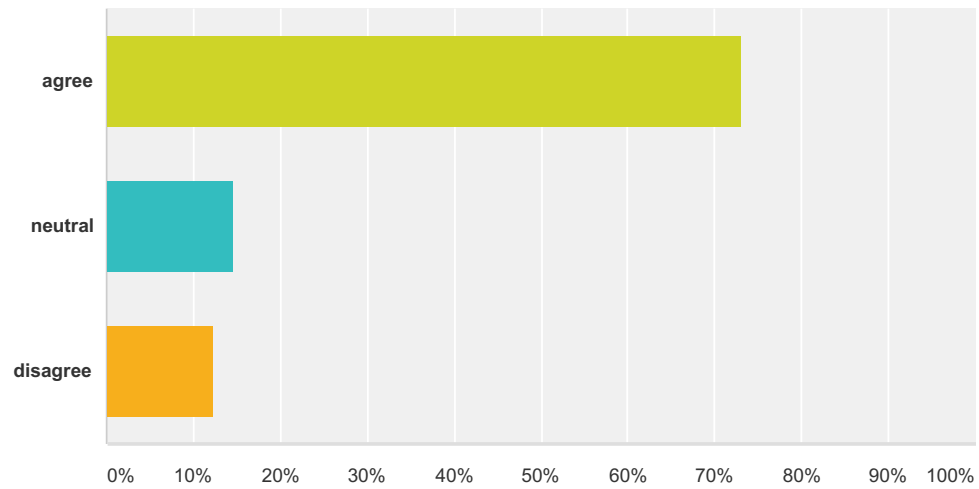

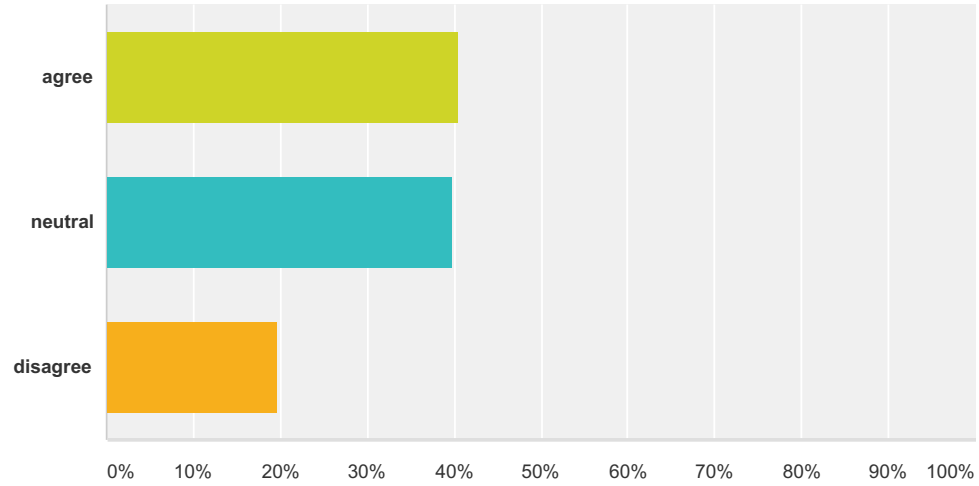

**Q9 I have attended or would consider attending a District seminar focused on membership in the future.**

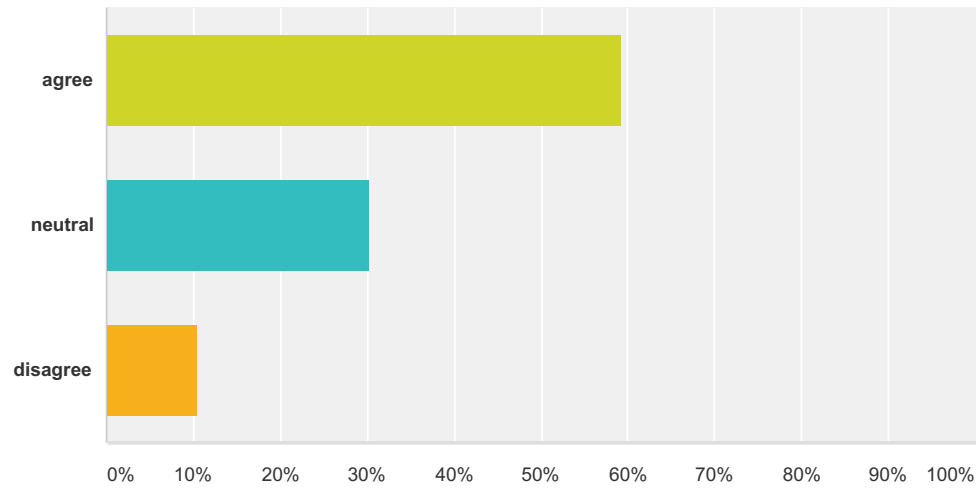

### Q10 I believe a District-sponsored mentorship program would be helpful for new members in their first year in Rotary.

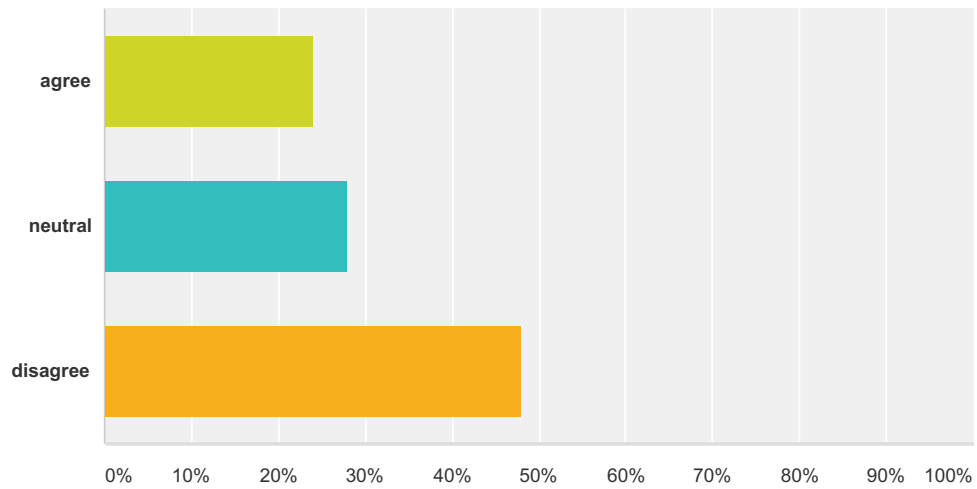

### Q11 My club could use help booking interesting speakers and programs.

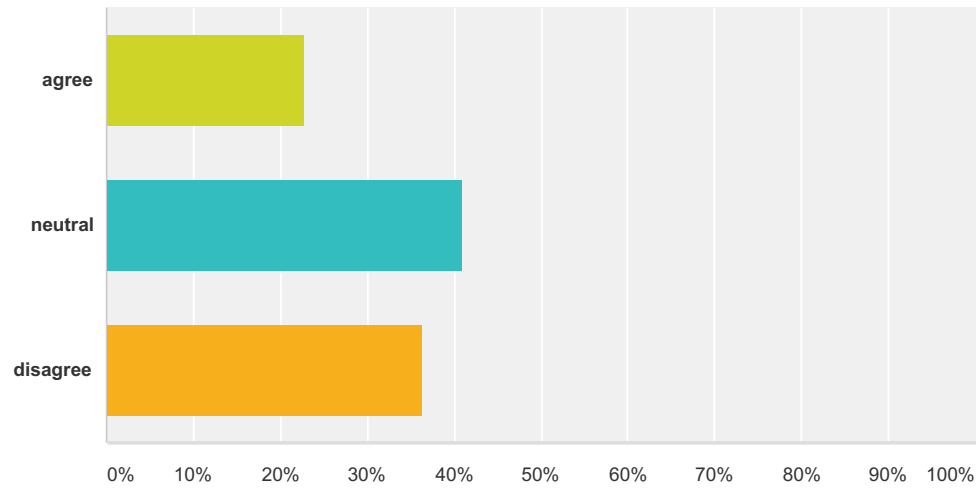

### Q12 My club would benefit from District support in establishing a Membership committee in my club.

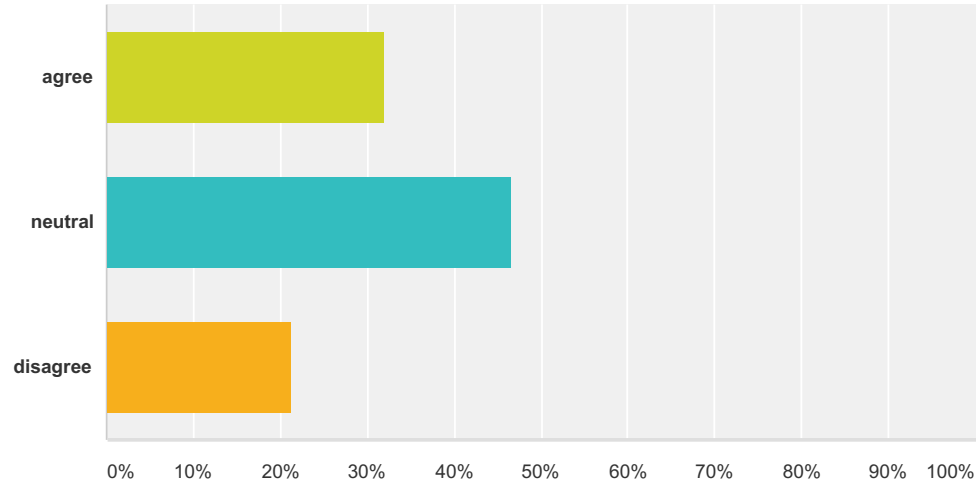

**Q13 I would participate in District wide or inter-club social/networking events if they were provided more frequently.**

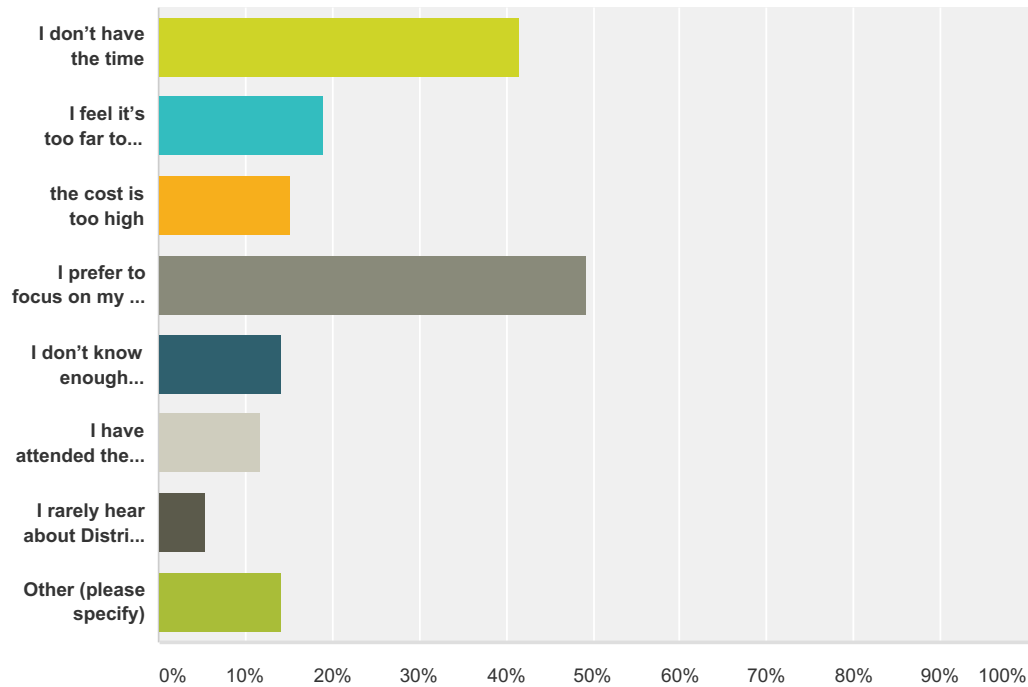

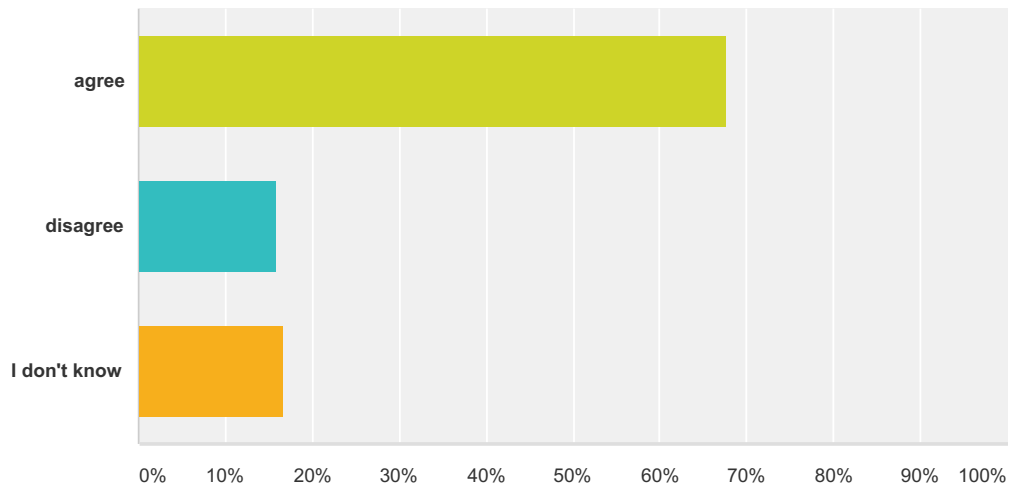

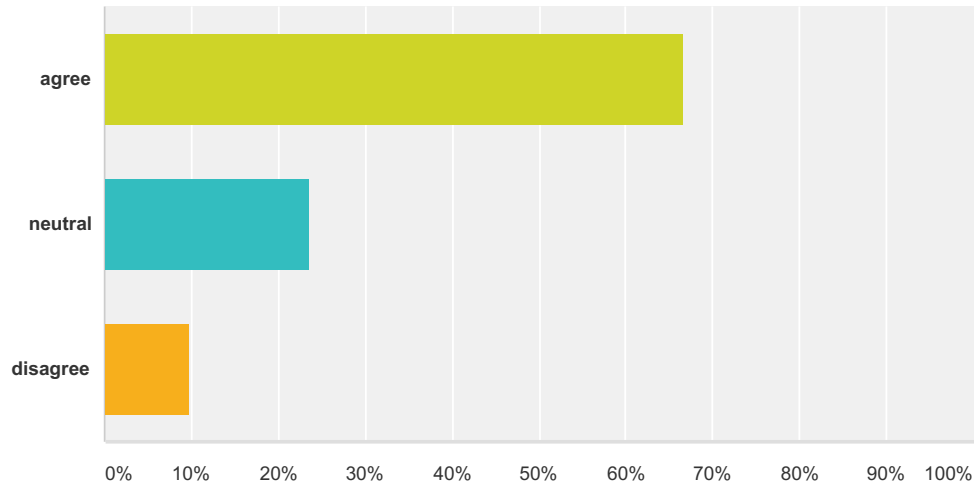

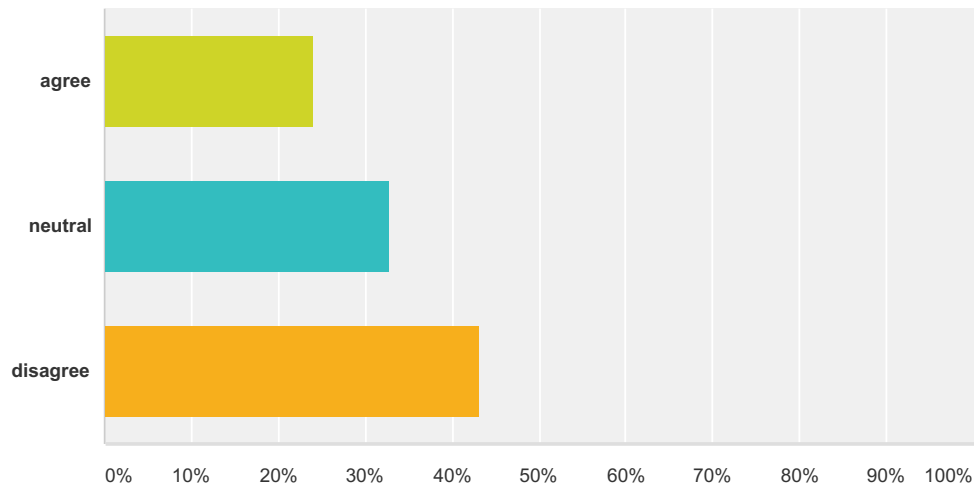

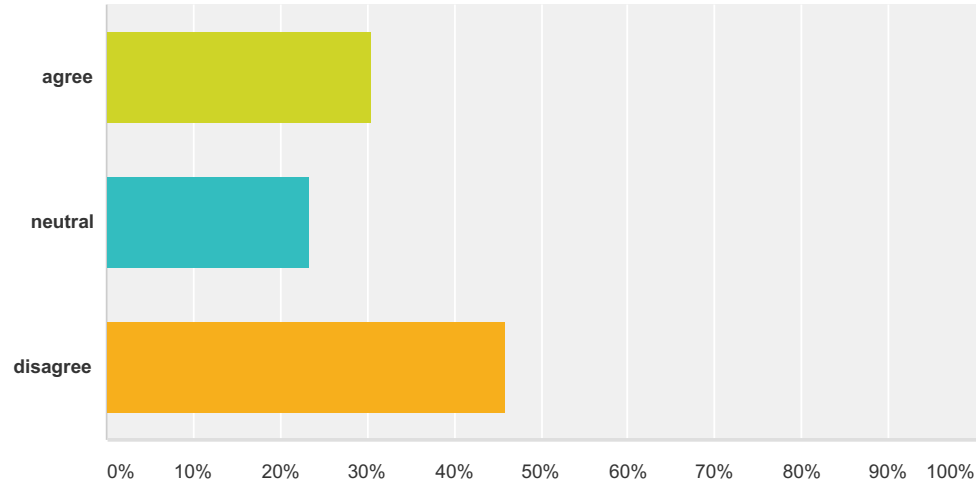

**Q19 I am aware of the process by which people are recommended for and nominated to serve at the District level.**

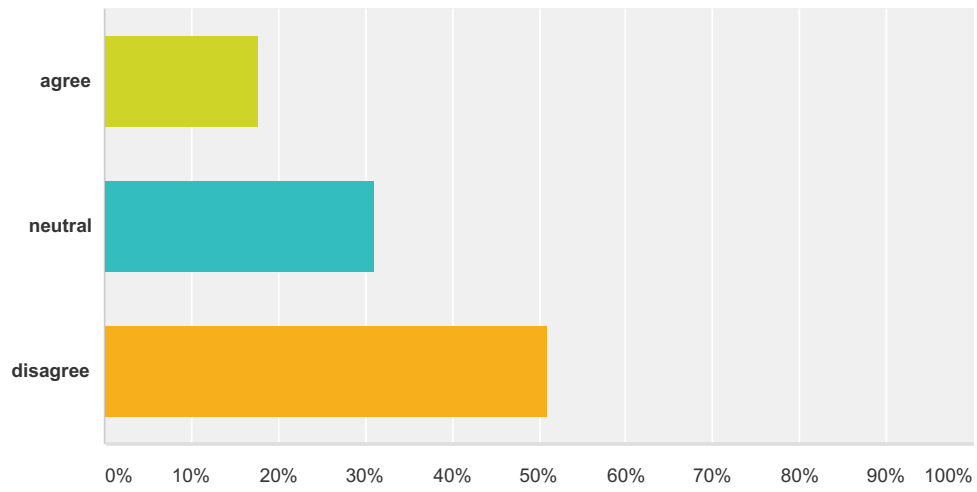

### Q20 I would consider serving a role in District leadership if I were chosen.

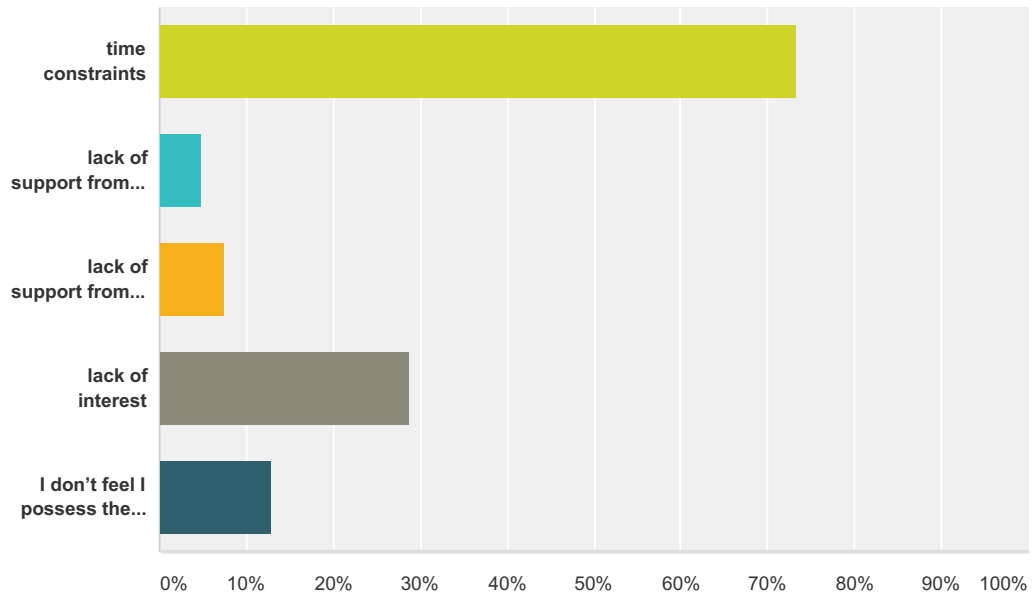

### Q21 Considering a leadership role in our District is not feasible for me due to: (check all that apply)

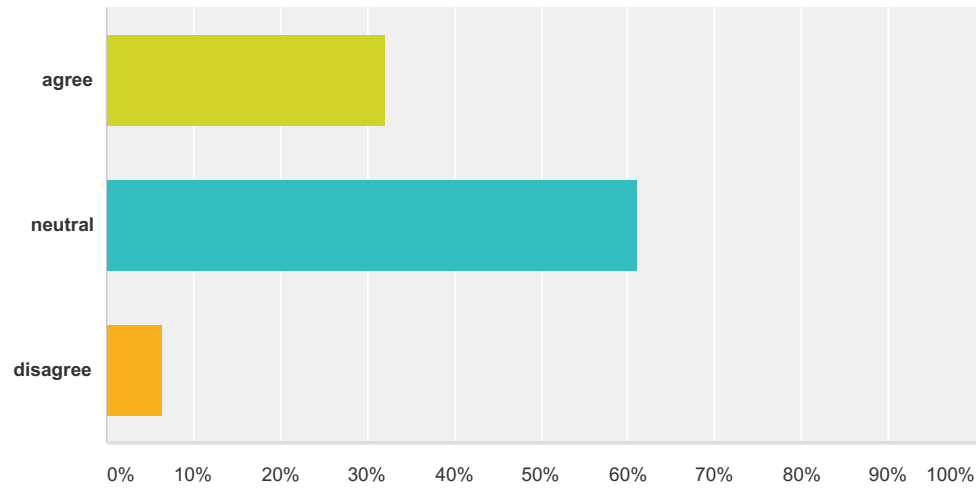

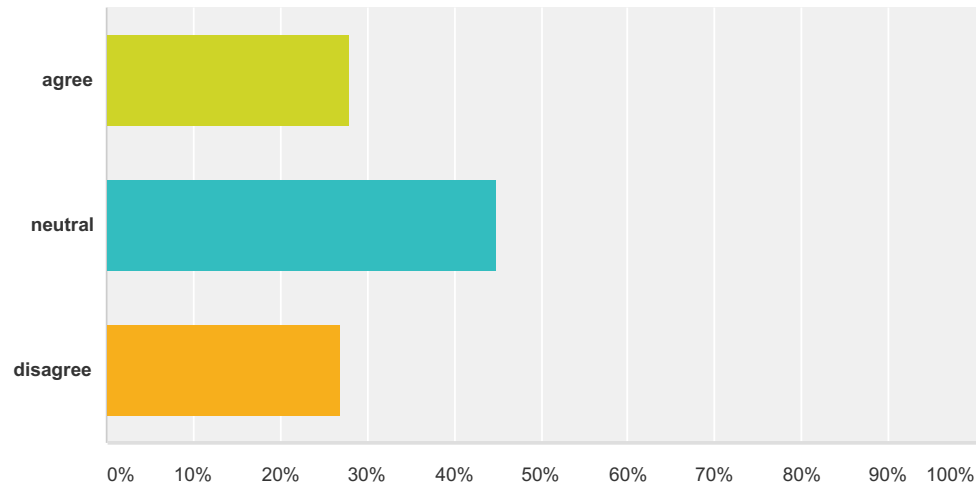

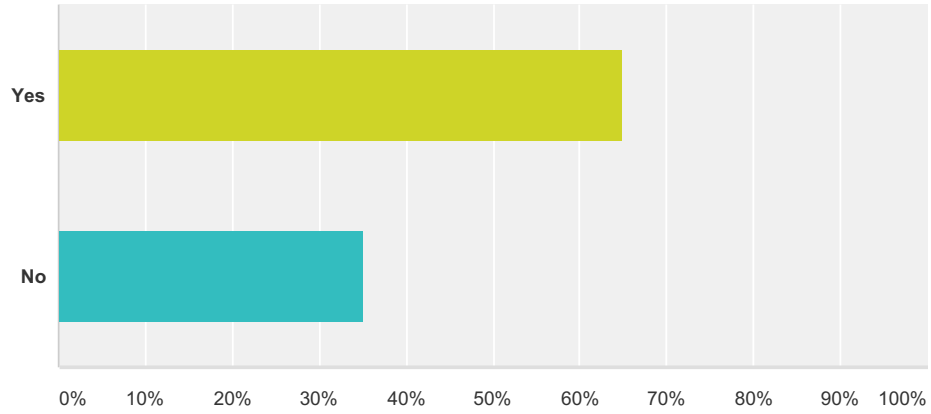

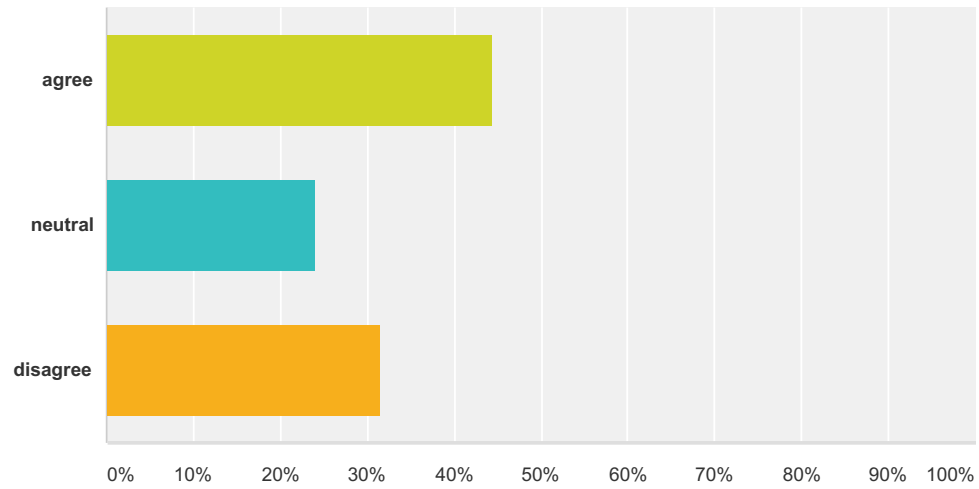

**Q25 Committee chair and leadership positions such as president, treasurer and secretary in my club are easily filled.**

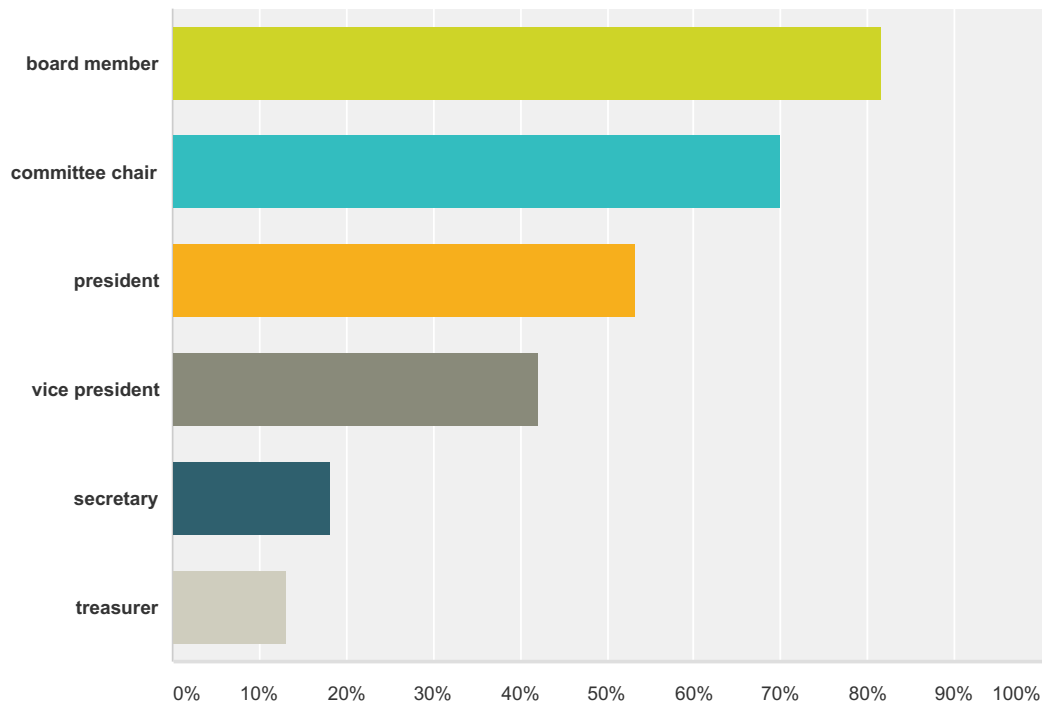

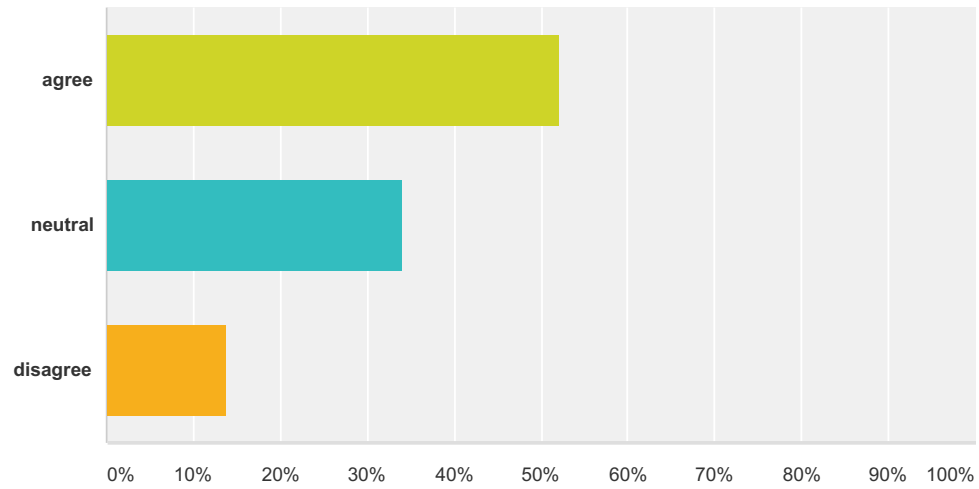

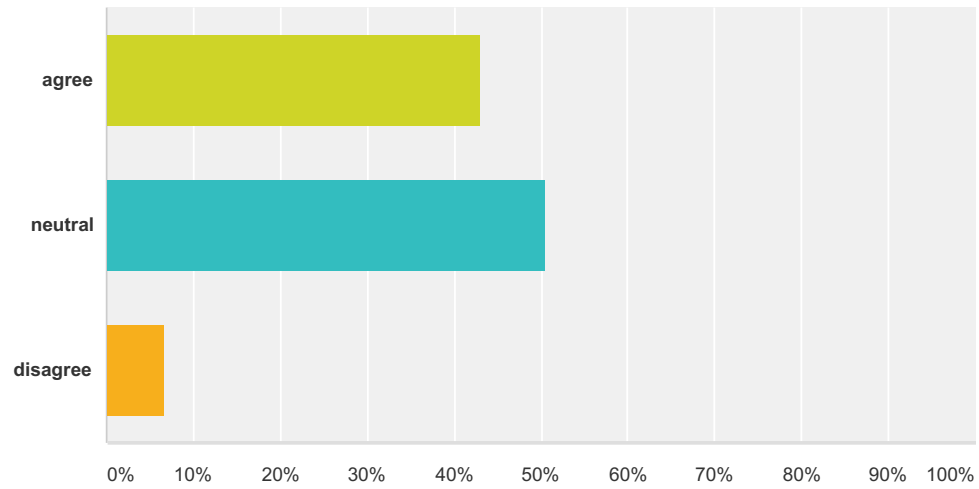

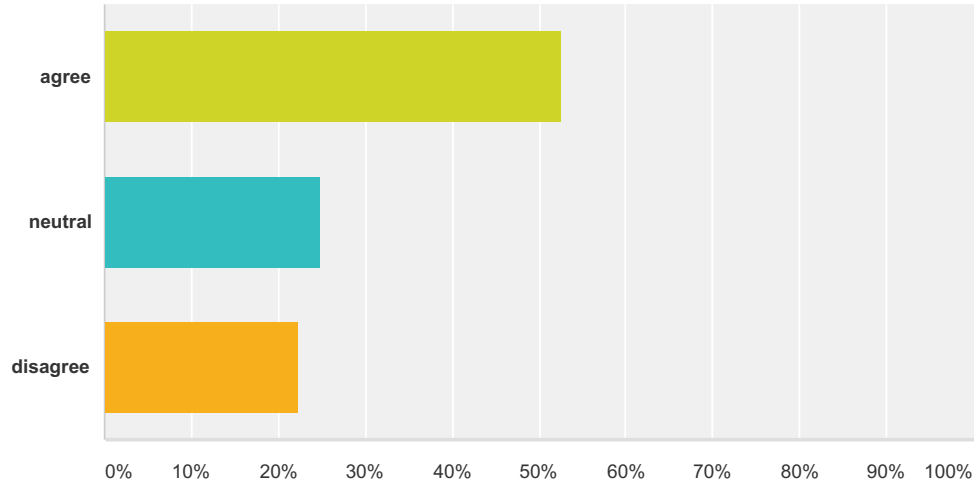

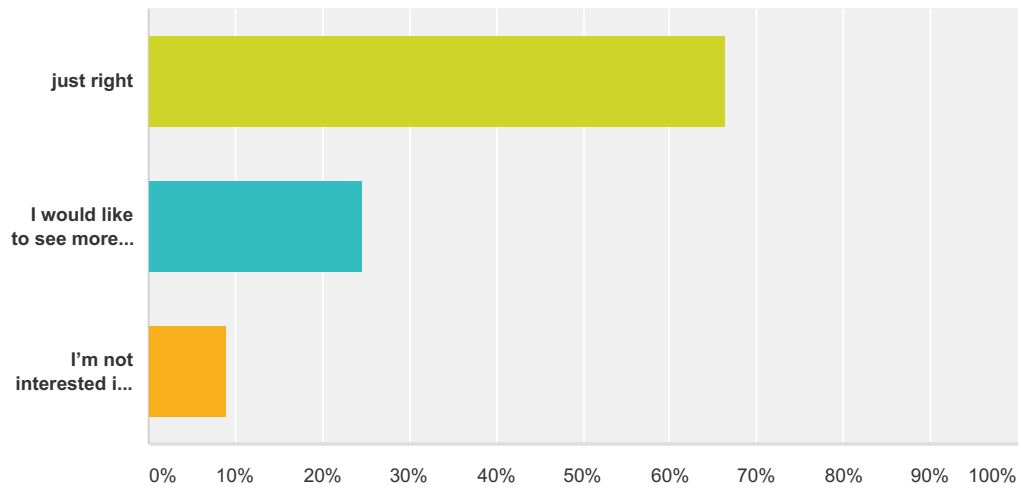

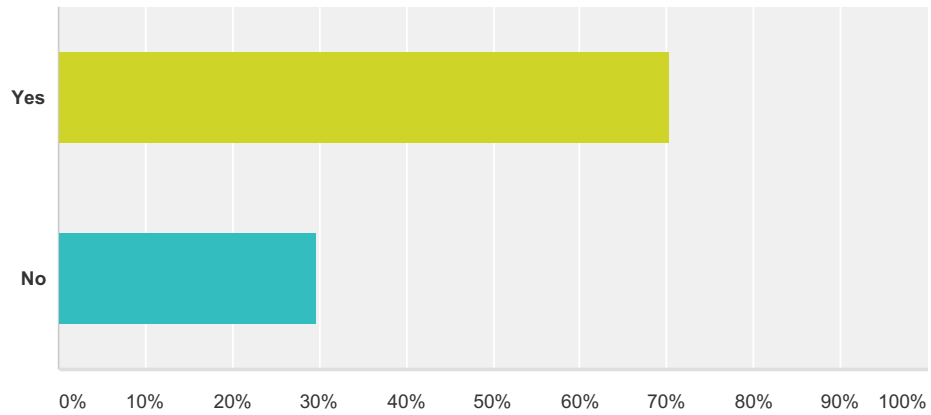

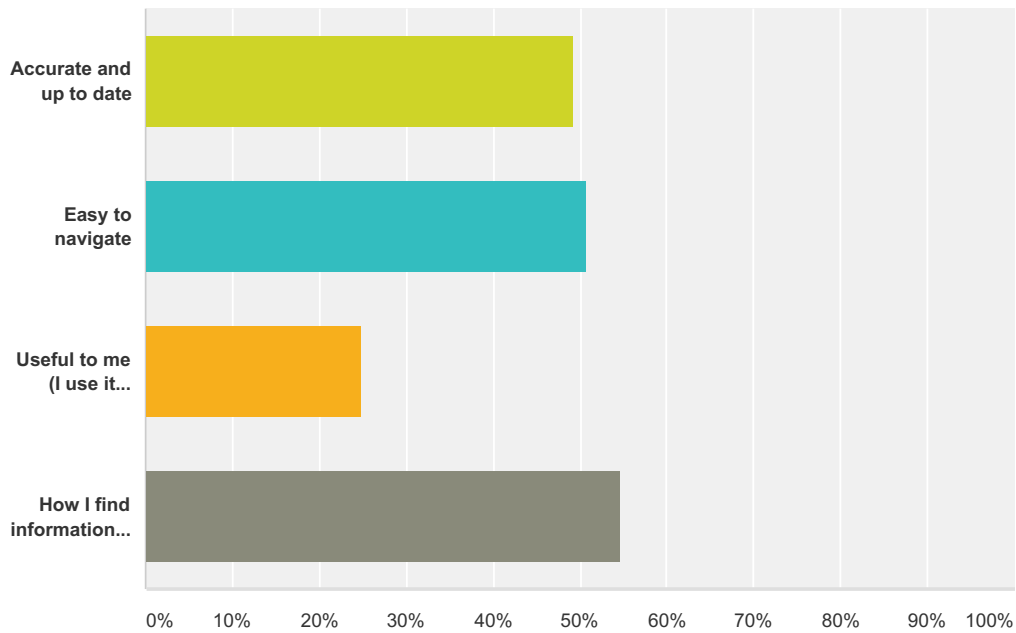

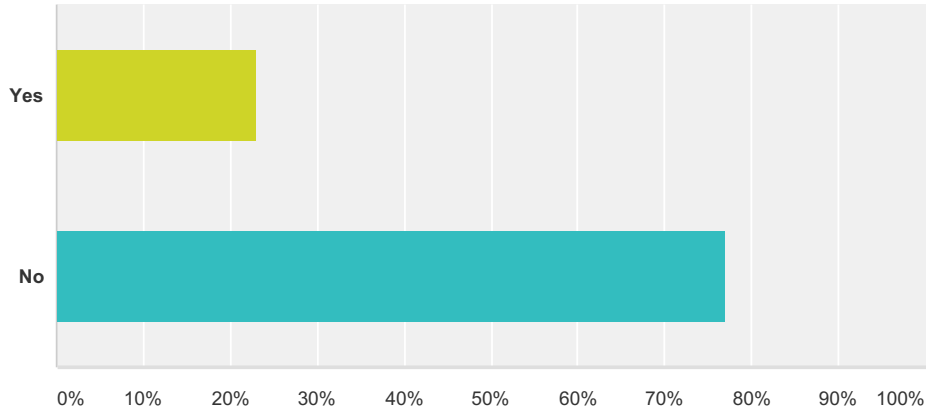

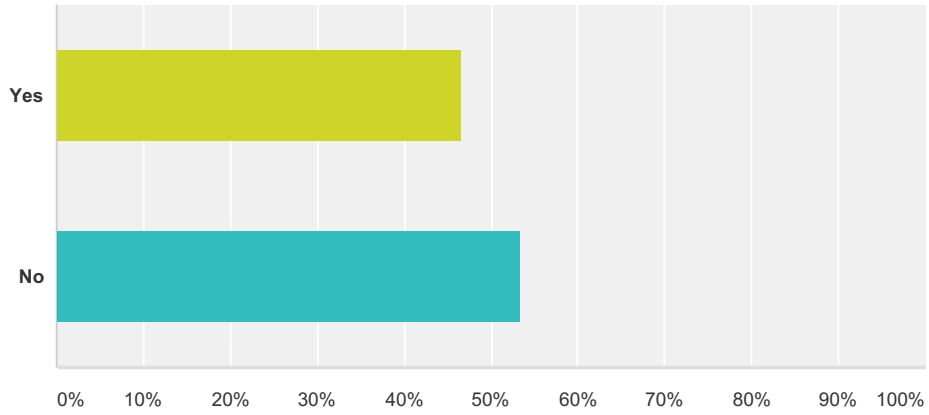

### Q34 I follow my Rotary club on Facebook.

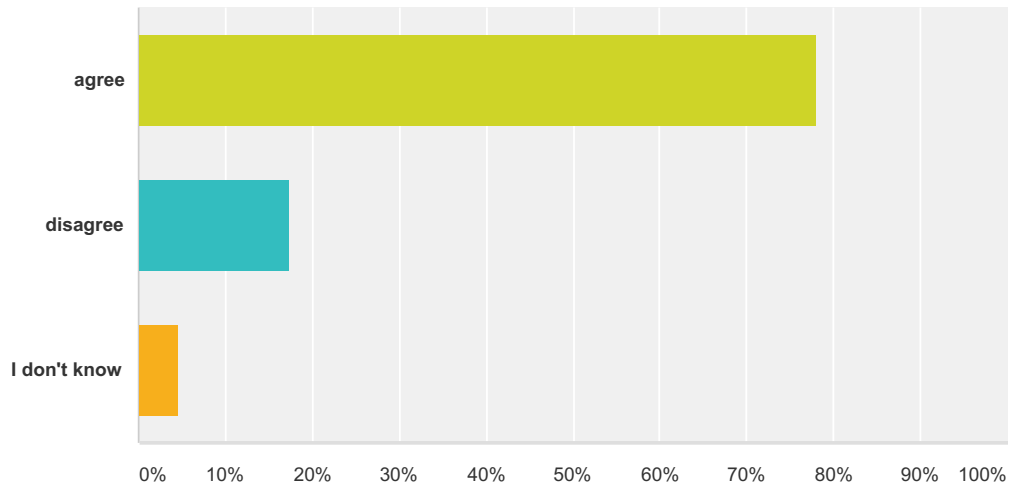

### Q35 Rotary symbols are prominent in our community and on all projects we participate in.

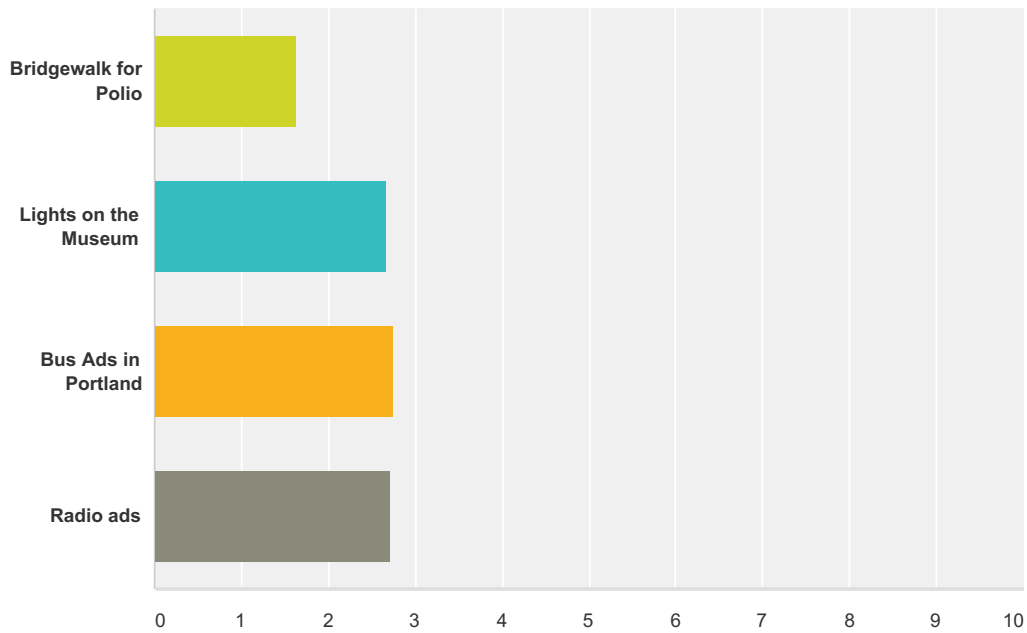

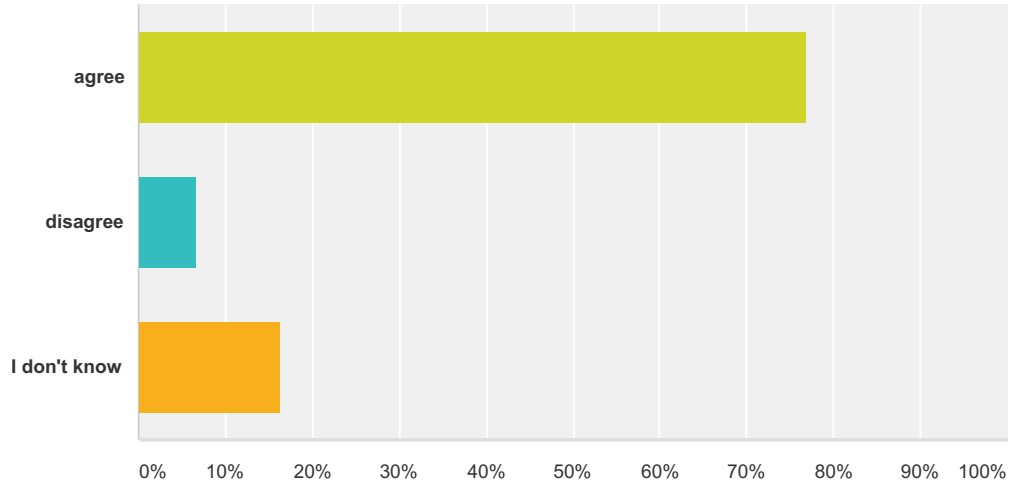

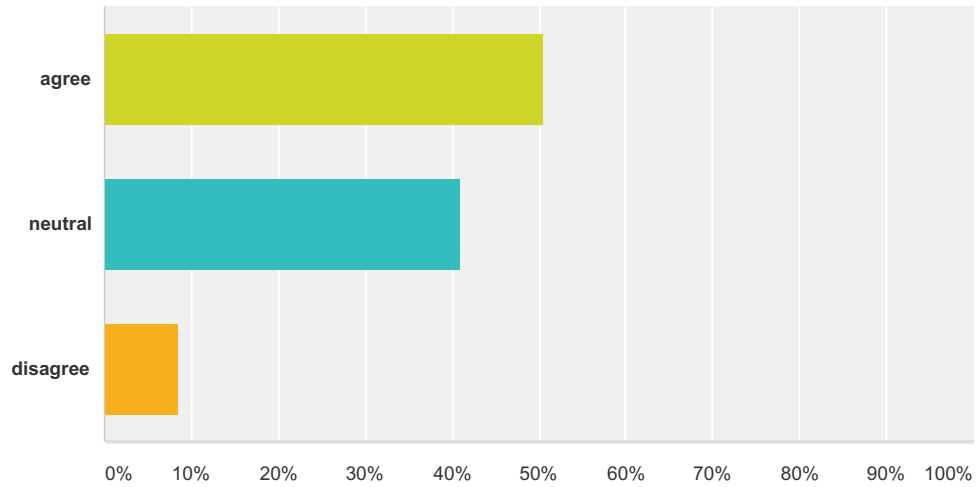

**Q39 The District actively promotes and identifies ways in which clubs can connect and work together on both local and international levels.**

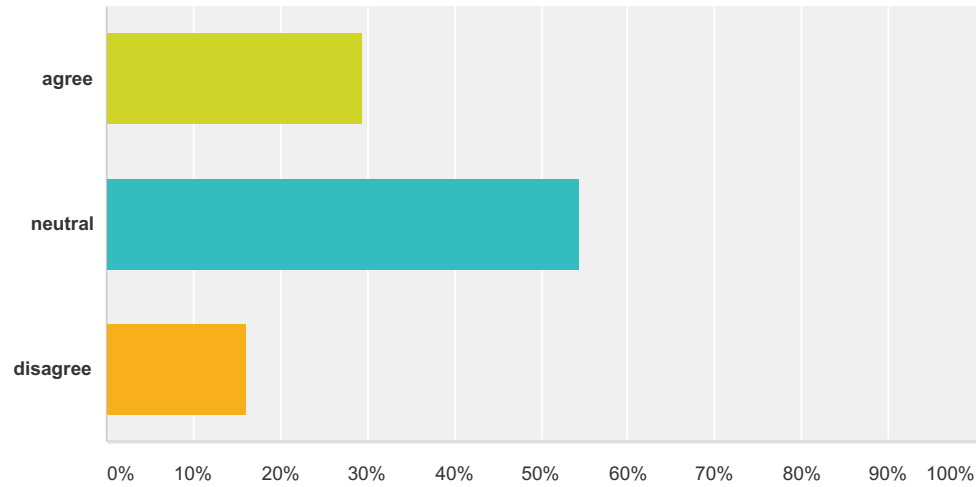

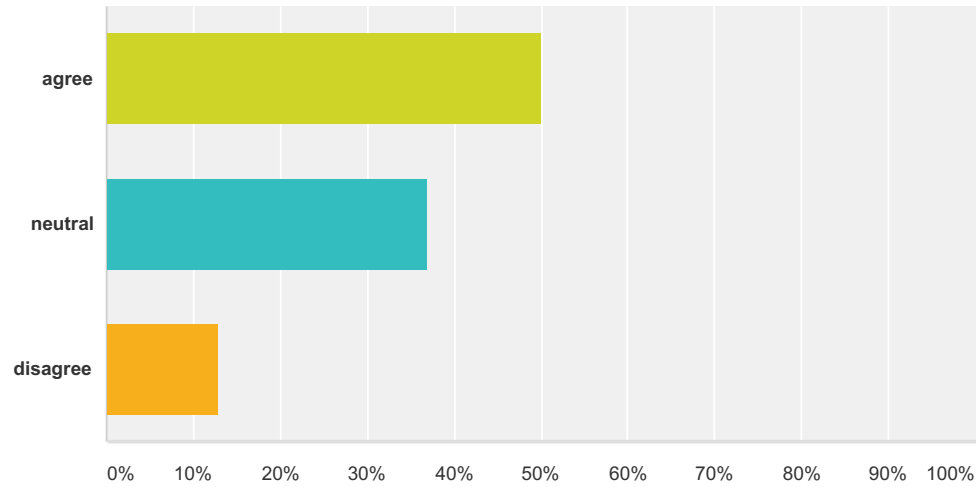

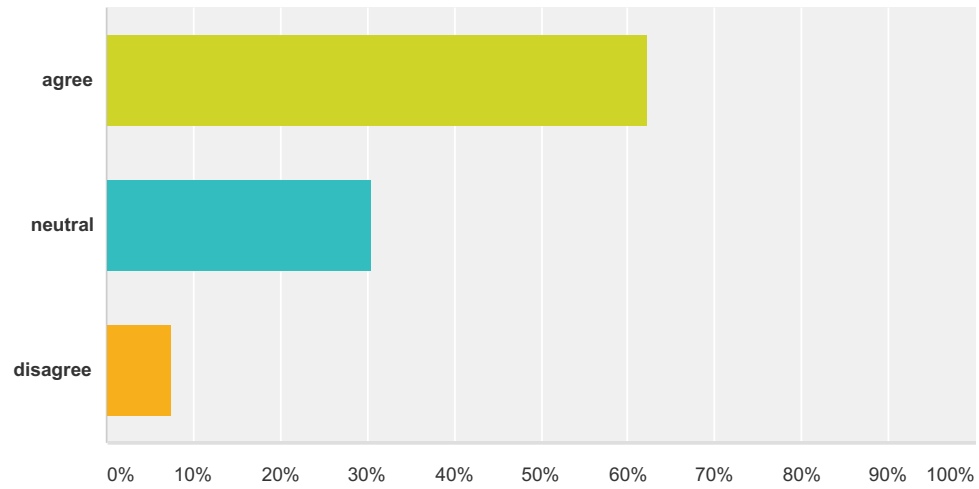

### Q42 Clubs are stronger and more likely to participate in collaborative events with support from the District.

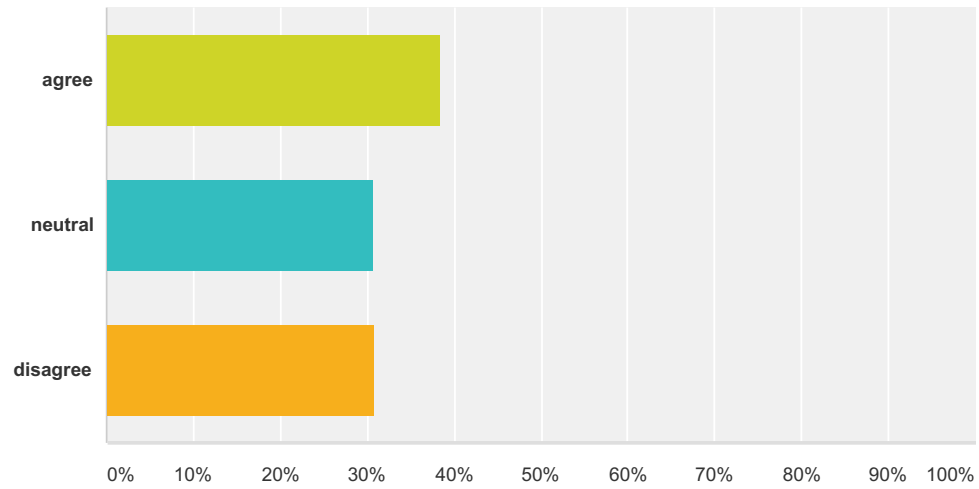
