Local Rotary Clubs will hold contest using the forms and documents contained within the package.

- Each club intending to participate in the competition must complete the club registration form and return it along with the \$200 registration fee to Jim Gulnac, Sanford-Springvale Rotary by April 11, 2014 jggulnac@gmail.com
- Each participating club will choose one winning video entry
- Each club's winning video will be submitted to Jim Gulnac (District 7780 Literacy Chair) jggulnac@gmail.com no later than May 2, 2014.
- A district-wide winner, and second / third place winners will be chosen by a panel of judges.
- The winner and runner-ups will be announced at the district conference on May 17, 2014. A \$500 cash prize will be awarded to the winner. Lesser cash prizes may be awarded to runner-ups, depending on the total number of entries.

Summary of Contest Rules:

- High school students, grades 9-12, who live or attend school in a community in District 7780 are eligible
- Individuals or teams of up to 5 students
- Content illustrates *"How can I use the 4-Way Test to make good decisions in my life?"* The situation can be anything that teens deal with - social situations, bullying, substance use, academic pressure - anything that's real in a young person's life.
- Content must be original work
- Video may be a narrative, mini-documentary, or Public Service Announcement (PSA)
- Video entry must be no less than 2 minutes and no more than 3 minutes long
