From the Governor's Desk

On my way back from a trip "Up north," the Glens Falls area, I got to thinking how much I enjoyed my last club visit, my makeup. Usually they are very interesting, lots of fun and very rewarding.

I was immediately taken back, and said, I was honored, but had nothing prepared. The

president of the club said, no problem, just tell us about your club and the projects you are working. By the way, just to make this a little more interesting, we were talking through an interpreter. I didn't mention this before, but everyone but me was speaking Slovene. Fortunately for me, one of the members of the club spoke English and translated everything. I think!

In any case, I gave it a try and started to talk about my club's location, number of members, our projects and fund raisers and gave very brief descriptions of how we ran our meetings. It was quite an experience for me, not sure about them. I concluded my talk, they applauded and I sat down. The way the members came up to me at the end of the meeting seemed to indicate that their thanks were sincere and that they all enjoyed the experience. There is one thing for sure; I definitely will never forget it.

So, if you are ever travelling and have an opportunity to do a makeup, do it. Rotarians are a fantastic group of people and always make you feel so very special. And of course they should, because we know for sure, especially this year, "be a gift to the world," is exactly what Rotarians are, anywhere you travel.

BTW, this month is Youth Services Month. What is your club doing with its Interact Club, Rotaract Club, and how is your Exchange student enjoying his/her year? If you're not sure, now is a good time to find out.



# 2016-17 Goals Help Session for PEs and Secretaries: Information on the IT Assistance Group Portion of the District 7190 Web Site Can Help!



# World Health Organization Wild Polio Virus Update Week ending 13 April

### **Headlines:**

- The World Health Assembly (WHA) Report on Poliomyelitis has been published. The report summarises the status against the Polio Endgame Plan and Resolution WHA68.3, adopted by the WHA in May 2015.
- Canada has announced a contribution of \$40 million Canadian Dollars to support the eradication
  of polio in Pakistan over the next three years.
- The globally synchronized switch from the trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine, the first stage of objective 2 of the Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan 2013-2018 will start on 17 April 2016. Learn more about preparations for the switch here. Learn more about the rationale for the switch through this series of videos.

**Afghanistan** No new cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week. The most recent case occurred in Nawzad district of Hilmand province, with onset of paralysis on 23 January. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 remains 2, compared to 1 reported for 2015 at this point last year.

**Pakistan:** One new case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) was reported in the last week, in Bannu district, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, with onset of paralysis on 22 March. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 is now 8, compared to 21 reported at the same date last year.



#### DISTRICT 7190 (adapted from District 6440) ROTARY SHORT-TERM EXCHANGE (STEP) PROGRAM OUTLINE

- SHORT TERM is a program that gives students age 15 to 18 ½ the opportunity to experience a cultural exchange in a foreign country for a time period of 4 to 8 weeks, instead of a whole year. This is done on a reciprocal basis.
- > The Hosting Club needs to meet District and RI policy (Club Pres, YEO, and Counselor need to have background check done).
- The Hosting Club YEO will visit, interview and qualify the host family and have them fill out the Host Home Application Form (background check required on all persons in household over 18 yrs).
- THE SENDING CLUB has to make sure that the student that wants to go abroad fills out the R.I. short-term application. Then the YEO of the sending club has to interview and qualify the student for the exchange and forward the application to the Short-term Youth Exchange Chair.
- > There is no cost for the Hosting Club. It is strongly recommended to invite the visiting student to at least one Rotary meeting for getting to know him/her.
- THERE IS NO COST FOR THE SENDING CLUB. All expenses are paid by the student's parents. The student needs to be invited to a club meeting before leaving on his/her exchange to be introduced to club members and after returning to give a short report of his/her exchange experience.
- Costs. Students pay for the airline ticket, spending money and a Rotary required health insurance plan (\$76-208 depending on options chosen). Our travel agency Tzell will provide assistance in travel plans.
- Processing fee for the application is \$ 125.00.


