RYLA emphasizes leadership, citizenship, and personal growth, and aims to:

- Demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth
- Provide an effective training experience for selected youth and potential leaders
- Encourage leadership of youth
- Recognize young people who are rendering service to their communities

District 7190's RYLA Program was created to help students that have untapped leadership potential. If you know of a student in the 11th grade that you look at and think, "*That student could be a great leader if only.*" then our RYLA Program is for them.
