

The third annual Schenectady Rotary-Steiner award in memory of former Schenectady Chamber of Commerce Executive and Rotarian, Chuck Steiner was recently presented to Mona Golub in recognition of her demonstrated excellence in both business and philanthropy. Steiner was revered for his leadership skills and his ability to unite people and organizations of divergent opinions toward a common goal. Attributes shared with Golub.

As Vice President of Public Relations and Consumer Services for the newly merged Northeast Grocery, Inc. - serving Price Chopper/Market 32 and Tops — Mona oversees corporate communications, community and government relations, consumer services, corporate social responsibility, and philanthropy for the nearly 300-store chain. She has been the driving force behind many of the unique, personalized partnerships that earned Price Chopper national recognition for its community involvement, customer connectivity and social responsibility over the years.

Outside of her pursuits in the supermarket industry, Mona established a series of free, world-class concerts and events at Schenectady's Central Music Haven back in 1990. As Volunteer Producing Artistic Director, she has invited audiences from all corners to 'travel the world one concert at a time' in the heart of Schenectady's Central Park. Music Haven's multi award-winning success inspired The Passport Series — Music Haven at Proctors Collaborative, which presents diverse international concerts in between summers.

Mona was born and raised in Schenectady, NY, graduated from Niskayuna High School and received a BA in English and Romance Languages with high honors from Bowdoin College. She is married to

Schenectady businesswoman Marie DeBrocky and is the proud mother of her 26-year-old son, Ira, who is a business consultant in NYC. She currently serves on the board of directors for Proctors Theater, The Schenectady Foundation, Discover Schenectady, The Foundation of The Chamber of the Capital Region and on several project and special event committees.

### **Are You Being Blessed?**

How do you know if you are being blessed? Does it require that you merely receive a blessing to appreciate it? Or does it require that you lose something first so as to realize just how blessed you have been all along? This is how I feel every time I return to the United States from my humanitarian mission trips to Haiti. I usually travel there once or twice a year on behalf of my Rotary club where we typically bring water filters to give to schools, orphanages and medical clinics. I have been doing this kind of work for 20 years and find it heart-breaking and yet simultaneously inspiring.

Haiti is a country 90 minutes by air flight from Miami. The country shares 1/3 of the island of Hispaniola along with the Dominican Republic which occupies the other 2/3. Haiti has a population of over 11 million people and is characterized as the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere. According to the US State Department, the average Haitian lives to the age of 62, the infant mortality rate is 14 times higher than the US, and unemployment is between 40-70% depending on how you define employment. Many of the deaths in Haiti are attributed to intestinal disorders caused by poor sanitation and lack of reliable, clean water. This is where my appreciation for blessings begins to become more apparent.

Here in the US, it is safe to say that even the water in the dirtiest restroom in the poorest community in America is likely safer to drink than the water in the nicest hotel in Haiti. In America we have naturally good water, abundantly obtained from filtered aquifers, chlorinated by application of law, and administered by countless water authorities across the US. Haiti lacks natural filtration in its soil. Chlorine is not put in by the municipalities and those who are able to obtain safe water are buying it from private vendors and/or Culligan. Yet, when you and I turn on the tap we likely do not think about how the water became safe to drink; nor do we consider that it might not be safe to drink. Oh, I know there have been some rare cases where a municipality was dealing with an unusual situation where there may

have been an impurity in the water supply, but you know these situations are rare, and they bring national attention and remediation. But imagine if the norm was that clean water needed to be purchased, daily, from some vendor of questionable merit. Imagine that a percentage of your income was constantly being spent to help cure your family of the illnesses they were suffering because of contaminated water. Imagine the heartache of seeing the weak in your family dying because you couldn't afford the cure.

As I asked earlier: how do you know you are being blessed? For me, it is helping with water projects in a country like Haiti where I see the devastation caused by poverty, corruption, inflation, lack of sanitation and lack of clean water. When I am able to place a free water filtration system into the hands of a school administrator, I know I am being a blessing to those school children. When I teach about hygiene in an orphanage, I know I am being a blessing in the lives of those orphans. And when I return to the US I am reminded that all of the blessings of being an American are still intact waiting to bless me as well.

For more information on how you can help the Schenectady Rotary in its clean water initiatives in Haiti, please contact me so you too may be a blessing to those who are in such great need.


