With a little luck, a new friendship with Just Because, a community minded group from Schaghticoke has been formed and the partnership will now host the event Thanksgiving Day, November 28, in their community. Thanks to Just Because, Twin Bridges will be able to make the meal deliveries to the people who are not able to go out or cook for themselves and frequently rely on Meals on Wheels which does not deliver on the holiday.

Food donations are coming in from many local businesses in the Schaghticoke area and the partnership will provide meal delivery. In addition, for those looking for company, the partnership has arranged for The American Legion Post 731 at 181 Main Street, Schaghticoke to open their doors for two seatings on Thanksgiving Day (reservations required) for a traditional turkey day meal with all the fixings and dessert!

Instead of being sidelined for 5-days each month, girls can stay in school, which helps break the cycle of child brides, too many children, and all the ills that accompany generational poverty. Did you know that Global Scientists rank educating women higher than solar panels and electric cars! Experts agree that **educating women is the silver bullet** for climate change, over population, poverty & injustice. Period.

Scotia Rotary has connected with the Rotary Club of Namugongo with the goal of providing 10,000girls in Uganda with a free MoonCatcher kit. The MoonCatcher design is perfect for a place like Uganda where the girls can't even afford underwear.
