Rotarians around the world are celebrating the announcement from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation that they are renewing their partnership with Rotary to continue the battle to eradicate Polio. This additional commitment of up to \$450 million dollars underscores the viability of the combined worldwide effort to erase this disease.

Rotary similarly partners with other organizations around the world in a wide variety of activities. Rotary-founded organizations like ShelterBox and Gift of Life continue to engage Rotarians where the need is greatest. In communities around the world, local and international organizations partner with Rotary Clubs to solve problems only as a private partnership can.

In a recent development, Toastmasters and Rotary announced a strategic partnership to augment the core capabilities of each organization. This is welcome news, as Toastmasters will work with us to help us tell the story of Rotary.


