Chituka Village Project

Dear Friends,

I'm writing to you in regards to a new project Banda Bola Sports Foundation is undertaking. We conquered the first challenge, of allowing the girls to play soccer. We're breaking barriers, BUT we're facing a new challenge.

Girls have been playing in dresses and skirts. They don't have a place to change into shorts comfortably. We provide them the shorts, but they change in the bushes or behind trees. Many of them are embarrassed and would rather play in the dress than get changed in this environment. This makes them feel undignified.

We need to build a space for them. We need to build a changing room and toilets to further empower these girls to play soccer and stay in school. We need your help.

15,000 bricks are required to build this structure. We have secured the land, it is currently being prepared for excavation, but we need the bricks. It costs \$1 per brick. We need \$15,000 to make this happen. We're calling this campaign - "A Buck for a Brick."

Thanks to the graciousness of our supporters, on Giving Tuesday (12/3), we were able to raise \$810 of the funds, leaving \$14,190 to go!

We have started a GoFundMe page, here. If you have the ability to donate toward this project, I would truly be grateful.

Also, if you would share this link on your social media pages and/or through email to those you think who would support this mission, I would appreciate any support you are able to give in this undertaking, to help empower girls and give them the dignity they deserve.
