### From the Governor's Desk

#### **A Solid Foundation**

Imagine you were charitably inclined. You decided that you wanted to help others, and you looked for charities that would help with basic human needs, from food to water and health, especially for children. You understood the importance of peace, community economic development and the role of literacy.

You might look for a series of charities that addressed each of those needs, and there are many specialized charities eager to put your money to work. So you find a reliable arbiter of charity integrity, such as Charity Navigator, and you search for your 6 or 7 charities that provide good work in the areas you decide to support.

You would quickly realize that many charities have excellent reputations, but don't seem to put enough of your money to work. They have substantial overhead, as they are not only in the business of doing good, they are also in the business of raising money in order to do good. Raising money can cost up to half of a charity's income.

What if there were an organization that held the highest rating from Charity Navigator, and gave almost all of the money donated to those directly in need? And what if it held not only the highest rating, 4 stars out of 4 stars, but also a perfect score of 100? And, in most years, 100% of the money raised is spent on the beneficiaries of the donation, because of a combination of volunteer implementation and a unique method of paying for the overhead?

We Rotarians know, of course, of such a charity. It's called The Rotary Foundation. We have done such a great job of building and

managing this fantastic organization, but we have forgotten to brag about how good it is.

If every Rotarian in our District signed up to donate just \$10 per month to TRF, we would raise over \$130,000 each year for our Foundation. Every club would qualify for special recognition as an EREY club (Every Rotarian Every Year).

Will you do your part? Remember, not every Rotarian can contribute. Within your club, are you willing to step up your donation to make up for those who can't?

The Rotary Foundation is the global philanthropic arm of our local clubs. Ask your club leaders how you can help continue the great work this solid foundation does.
