Could You Be Our CNY Rotary Leader for 2026-27?

It is time once again for us to seek nominations for a President of CNY Rotary. Similar to how we found our President Nominee last spring, we'll open up nominations for one month and a candidate must be nominated by their club. But that doesn't mean you have to wait to see if your club asks you! If you are interested and qualified, you can approach your club's president to ask them to take your name to the board and help you complete the nomination form.

To qualify, you will have to have been in Rotary for seven years by the time you take office July 1, 2026. You also have to have completed a year as a club president and be an active member in good standing. And you will want to be someone who thrives on meeting new people, enjoys sharing the inspiring word of Rotary, and likes traveling around our beautiful region.

Preparation for becoming President of CNY Rotary will start as soon as the candidate is confirmed with joining the leadership team and attending multiple trainings provided (and paid for) by Rotary International. There will be plenty of time to ramp up your Rotary IQ, work with the CNY Rotary team and hone your leadership skills.

All nominations are due by October 31st and interviews will be conducted in November via zoom.

Being a volunteer leader is a special role that requires more sacrifice, but is richly rewarding. Whether it is you who is up for the challenge, or you know someone else who would be a great fit, now is the time to act. Thank you in advance to the candidates who come forward and to the nominating committee for their important work in this process!


Long Time Golf Tournament Organizer Steps Down

Recently, Glenville Rotarian Dennis McGlauflin stepped down as the Chairperson of Glenville Rotary's Annual golf tournament. He did so proudly and respectfully. This year Glenville's golf tournament, held at Pinehaven Country Club in Guilderland, NY was a huge success with a record number of participating golfers. Pinehaven Country Club is a PGA private country club which closed for the day to host the tournament as they have done for every Glenville Rotary and Gift of Life golf tournament Dennis has chaired. They are by "par" the best in the area. Dennis' expertise as Chairperson for various golf tournaments extends over 17 years, starting in 1983 with the National Kidney Foundation. As a kidney cancer survivor, his immediate response was that he would gladly take on that responsibility. He has always believed in giving back to the community and helping others Dennis chaired four events for them. Several years passed and when he moved to the capital region, he saw on the billboard at the Village Queen Diner that Glenville Rotary was having a golf tournament. At the time he knew nothing about Rotary but took the opportunity to play golf and meet new people he now calls his friends. Dennis joined Glenville Rotary and was also asked to become a Board member for Gift of Life. He was part of the Gift of Life board for three years, and in first couple of months of joining the board was asked if he could help organize and run their golf tournaments. The Gift of Life mission is to provide cardiac treatment for children from emerging countries. In those three years he helped

In his last stance as golf tournament Chairperson, Dennis organized and ran three successful golf tournaments for Glenville Rotary so that they could help give back to the community and help others. So now, after 17 tournaments of running golf tournaments, Dennis has announced that he has officially retired as the Glenville Rotary Golf Tournament Chairperson. He requests that as members carry on organizing future golf tournaments, that they continue following the Rotary 4-way test. In addition, he thanks everyone who has helped him in helping others over the past 17+ years he served as Golf Tournament Chairperson.

On behalf of all the people Dennis has helped over the years, we would like to say 'thank you' to him. Thank you for the hard work and dedication, and the love and devotion he has poured into all the Golf Tournaments he has successfully chaired over the years, and for the resulting money generated to help so many others.

A Charitable Foundation of Your Very Own

How would you like to start your own Charitable Foundation? You could even name it after yourself, like "The Mary Smith Charitable Fund". The Rotary Foundation can set it up for you. It's fast. It's free. The money you add to your own fund is federally tax deductible. Anyone who contributes to your fund also gets a tax deduction. No need to submit annual tax returns because The Rotary Foundation will do that for you. Who decides how the money is invested? Who decides how the money is spent? It can be you. Or your children. Or your grandchildren. Or your club members. Or anyone you select. What's the catch? Well, you will need to contribute 1% to the Rotary Foundation every year. So, if your fund has \$10,000, your Fund will automatically contribute \$100 to The Rotary Foundation. But guess what? The Rotary Foundation is restricted to using your \$100 to carry out charitable projects. Who could ask for more than that? So, Mary Smith, if you would like more information on setting up The Mary Smith Charitable Fund, contact Heidi Stimac, Planned Giving Specialist, The Rotary Foundation, 847.866.3188, planned.giving@rotary.org. Or you can contact Niskayuna Rotary at NiskyRotary@gmail.com. Niskayuna Rotary has already set up its own fund and would be glad to help you or your club or your organization do the same. Our Fund is named after the major donor, "The William Green III - Niskayuna Rotary Donor Advised Fund #451". Our fund has about \$20,000, so the interest earned allows creating a Paul Harris Award annually, as was the original intent.

But be aware that TRF Donor Advised Funds are restricted to donating to other 501c3 organizations and for scholarships. This means you won't be able to use the funds for club projects, like putting up benches in the park. But you can use the funds to donate to The Rotary Foundation's Annual Fund, Polio Plus, Rotary Grants, all of which create Paul Harris Awards. And your fund can donate to the many registered charities in your neighborhood and across the nation.
