From the Governor's Desk

Anyone who knows me well, knows that I love quotes. Quotes inspire me and perhaps make me think in ways I had not considered before. I have quotes all over my home and office. Thank You to PDG Fred Carvin for some of the quotes that I have been inspired by in his book Capital Region Rotary-A History of Rotary International in District 7190 and for others I asked to supply me with their favorites. I hope you will enjoy the quotes I have included below.

PDG Arvie Eldred, District 7190 stated in his District Conference speech on April 8, 1947, "What kind of community do we as Rotarians want? We as Rotarians have the power within to generate a lot of energy to get the things we want and it is our duty as Rotarians to do it."

PDG E. Victor Wiley, District 7190 stated in January 1949, "It is important that we review our history and growth once in a while just to refresh our memories and renew our faith in this movement we know as Rotary international. None of us know too much about Rotary, and most of us know too little."

For our Presidents: PDG Albert Bantham, District 7190 stated in November 1948, "The Presidency of the Rotary club in not just another honor, to be discharged with as little effort as possible. The eyes of the members and the citizens of the community are on the incumbent all the time."

PDG George Reynolds, District 7190 stated in January 1973, "The Rotary emblem you wear on your lapel is more than a piece of jewelry. It is a badge of distinction, a symbol of pride, a link with fellow Rotarians the world over. Wear it daily-with pride."

PDG George Frost, District 7190 stated in his governor's newsletter January 1985, "The Paul Harris recognition is neither a decoration or something given because it is paid for. The honor and privilege of being able to contribute is by no means diminished when the Rotarian himself makes the contribution. It matters not who pays when the

contributions are for causes of world understanding and peace-a Paul Harris Fellow is an exceptional honor."

PDG John Quatrini, District 7190 stated in an interview November 2003, "We can add members all over the place. The bigger question is keeping those we have. Retention is involvement. If you have people involved in things they want to do, then they will always stay with you."

PDG C. Blair Hartman, District 7190 stated in an interview December 2003, "The perfect Rotarian is someone who wants to do some service, who feels the obligation to give back and who is willing to help. The perfect Rotarian will come to meetings, take on tasks when asked to, and get other people involved."

Trustee Mary Beth Growney Selene, who will be our featured speaker at our Foundation Event in November, provided me with her favorite quote, "I've learned that people will forget what you've said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel" Maya Angelo

PDG Harriet "Pepi" Noble, District 7190: "If you think you are too small to make a difference, try sleeping with a mosquito" Dali Lama

PDG Susan Austin, District 7190: "Be the change you want to see in the world" and "Be the person your dog thinks you are."

PDG Melissa Ward, District 7190: "If you're not having fun, you are doing it wrong"

And last but certainly not least, DGE Larry Jones has as his tag line on his emails, "In the firm belief that a strong and vital Rotary movement is in the highest interests of people everywhere" William Rusher

WOODSTOCK FESTIVAL HISTORY

On August 15 through 18, 1969, one of the most celebrated music festivals in history took place in Bethel, New York. At a time when Americans were deeply divided, over 400,000 people from across the country gathered in Max Yasgur's fields to celebrate "Three Days of Peace and Music." The three days of legendary performances, unimaginable mud, and unforgettable experiences helped the Woodstock Music and Art Fair become a symbol of an entire generation.

FESTIVAL FACTS

~ The community was not prepared for the crowds that began arriving. By Thursday, August 14, much of the area had become an enormous traffic jam.

~ Jimi Hendrix played what many consider to be the festival highlight, on Monday, August 18, when only 35,000 people—a small fraction of the crowd—remained.
