Rotary speaks first- Thank you everyone for joining us today as we celebrate the dedication of our peace pole. We come together today to dedicate this Peace Pole and now one of more than 200,000 in 180 countries. A Peace Pole is an internationally-recognized symbol of the hopes and dreams of the entire human family, standing vigil in silent prayer for peace on earth.

This idea began with Mr. Masahisa Goi after World War II and the dropping of the atomic bombs. Mr. Goi came to understand that words, thoughts, and intentions carry energy strong enough to influence the destiny of all living beings and by speaking, acting, and living in the spirit of the prayer, May Peace Prevail on Earth, the energy field of love and harmony would radiate forth to all of creation. The four languages on this pole –Arabic, Spanish, English, and Hebrew – unite us with our sisters around the world. In 1985 "we are the world" recorded the world must come together as one it is time to lend a hand to life the greatest gift of all.

2nd peace pole committee member-The poles are intended to inspire unity among people of all backgrounds and cultures, and to serve as a silent prayer

for peace. Rotary Peace Poles are part of Rotary's focus on peacebuilding and conflict prevention.

Planting a Peace Pole is a way of bringing people together to inspire, awaken and uplift the human consciousness the world over. It is a wonderful project for any community, organization or your home. Peace Poles are now recognized as the most prominent international symbol and monument to peace. They remind us to think, speak and act in the spirit of peace and harmony. Stand as a silent visual for peace to prevail on earth.

3rd Rotarian-Peace starts with each one of us. Spreads out to our clubs. Eventually it reaches out to zones and the world clubs. Peace is the best way to lead. To lead your life in peace and inspire others. Perceive rotary as an institution that preaches and practices peace.
