

# Rotary Good News stories from the Northwest of District 9700

## Trundle and Pambula

Trundle is a very small town some 70 kilometres North of Forbes and is not only drought affected but has also a water shortage problem. Currently, the Trundle Primary Schools has access to underground water and has set up a laundry and bathroom area on the school site to enable farmers, townsfolk and their families to bath, shower and wash their clothes.



On the far NSW coast a group of Rotarians from the Pambula, a small town just North of Eden left on Thursday, 22nd November 2018, and, in convoy, took the 600 kilometre drive to Trundle to help out with the drought.



They all moved into the grand old Royal Hotel, dined at the hotel as well as the Trundle RSL, purchased soap powder, for the Primary School laundry, presented every school child with a booklet on

Pambula, donated books on the Far South Coast to the school library, painted some of the school buildings, hosted a Saturday night dinner at the RSL, visited the Trundle Mens' Shed, spent money on newspapers, souvenirs, personal items in Trundle wherever they could. All this activity cemented a great Adopt-a-town relationship between the two towns.

The **Pambula Rotary Club** is now preparing an application for the release of \$5,000 from the twin districts 9700 and 9710 RAWCS Drought Relief Project Fund to help finance the chartering of a bus to transport and support Trundle school children to Pambula during the school holidays for a beach holiday on the South Coast.
