

It is with great excitement that I present my first report (July-August) for the year 2013-14.

After ironing out some difficulties with various requests and feedback it was very satisfying to receive these statistics.

Thank you to The Rotary Clubs of Bathurst, Bathurst Daybreak, Blayney, Forbes Ipomoea, Junee, Lake Cargelligo, Narrandera, Oberon, Orange Daybreak, Orange North, Wagga Wagga Kooringal, Wagga Wagga Murrumbidgee, Wagga Wagga Sunrise, West Wyalong, Wollundry Wagga Wagga and Yenda for their time and effort in compiling their reports.

The total hours committed for this period was 1,108.5. If we value that time at a conservative \$30 per hour, the value of Rotarians' time to their communities is \$33,255. This figure represents the time spent by Rotarians in only 16 Clubs in District 9700 for the months of July and August.

Our clubs are to be congratulated on their wonderful voluntary commitment to our service projects.

I would also like to congratulate Dr Alok Sharma and members of the Wagga Wagga Rotary club on their recent dinner to raise funds for his forthcoming RAWCS Project "Darkness to Light" involving Alok and his team of volunteers, both Rotarians and community members, travelling to India to perform cataract operations on local people.

Thank you again for all your service projects and its ongoing outcomes to many communities both local and abroad. As the \$ figure illustrates, with these hours from the clubs that have submitted them for this short time, Rotary, even just in this District, is BIG business! - 3. If your Club has a District Grant, provide the members with an update on progress the expected date of completion and what it will mean for your community.
- 4. Select a non-Rotarian member of your community to be named a Paul Harris Fellow and plan a dinner around the presentation with that person as the Guest Speaker.
- 5. Make a Club contribution to the Foundation Annual Giving to build credits for a PHF presentation at the Changeover.
- Support DG Geoff by joining the Centurions with a personal contribution of \$100 that is Tax Deductable (please advise PDG John Egan of any new Centurions).
- 7. Make a Club contribution to the End Polio campaign and at the same time build PHF credits for the Club.
- 8. Ask the members for ideas that may be the basis for a District Grant Application early in 2014.
- 9. If your Club has received a Foundation Grant in the past, use this as the basis for a presentation to inform new members about what you have done to benefit the local community.
- 10. It may be practical for an informal meeting to be held at the site of a project completed with a Foundation Grant
- 11. Plan for your community to become a 'Rotary Peace Community'.

12. If you are in the northern part of the District, make up a table to attend the Foundation Dinner in Orange on Tuesday, 26th November.
