ROTARY 'ANGELS'

Wagga based Geoff Hamilton of Wollundry Rotary is one of the Angel Flight Team around NSW.

Typical of the work of Angel Flight was a recent flight taking a patient and her husband from Sydney back to Hay following treatment.

The patient Michelle has a thyroid gland problem that requires surgery as it is restricting her airway.





Specialist medical attention is required and the family with four young children was deemed eligible for an Angel Flight by local medical staff saving them a 7-8 hour drive each way to Sydney.

Angel Flight is a charity that coordinates non-emergency flights for financially and medically needy people and Wagga Wollundry Rotary are one of the many supporting organisations.

Angel flights are free and pilots donate their time and aircraft with fuel being reimbursed by Angel Flight.

Out of human darkness caused by cataracts and other optical problems, Wagga Rotarian and ophthalmic surgeon Alok Sharma has brought light and sight to thousands of people in India.

Sponsored by Leeton Central Rotary, over one hundred Group 3 Rotarians and their wives attended a meeting in the historic Hydro Hotel in Leeton to hear about this volunteer overseas aid work.

According to District Coordinator John Hamblin of Young Rotary, participating in the clinics was a very humbling and rewarding experience.

We take junior cricket as a right of passage for local youngsters, with dozens of kids joining their peers and parents on Saturdays for a morning of batting, bowling, fielding and great fun.

But for children with a physical disability, signing up for the local squad is not always an option, despite the fact these children would gain the same benefits as their more physically able peers, and that's where Rotary stepped in.

Further clinics are being organised for Forbes, Orange and Wagga for early in 2012 and the aim is for a Gala Days across the District in the spring next year.





There's always something positive comes out of a meeting with New Zealanders, (test cricket matches aside), and District Governors and their partners from New Zealand and Australia share a special bond each year.

They share their training, aspirations and dreams at several meetings along the way – and many unique friendships evolve.

Such was the case with Governor David and his wife Margaret Drake of Christchurch, NZ (District 9970) met with Governor Ian Simpson and Jean at a Briefing Weekend in Parramatta in July, 2010.

After the first Christchurch earthquake last year, the Simpsons contacted the Drakes to enquire about their safety and possible damage to property.

David told Ian their home had escaped major damage with the only

The wine was the product of a project by Orange North Rotary in 2010.

Rotarian Ian Davison donated a block of Shiraz grapes from his vineyard on the slopes of Mount Canobolas as a fund raising project.

Wagga Sunrise Rotary celebrated the 20th anniversary of the club receiving its charter in November 1991 with a dinner for past and present members at the Wagga R.S.L Club.

The Club was sponsored by Wagga Kooringal Rotary and was the first breakfast club in Rotary District 9700.

It began on 29th November with 47 members and with Brian Andrews as first president, and pioneered female Rotary membership in Wagga Wagga.

There are seven charter members who have maintained their membership over the twenty years of the Club's existence: Bernie Benson, Yvonne Braid, Peter Brown, Peter Gissing, Bill O'Rourke, Val Samuelson, and John Wood.

Sunrise Rotary currently has 47 members and 50% are women.

The Club has strongly supported local causes in Wagga Wagga while contributing to national health initiatives and supporting humanitarian

Grenfell Rotarian is Burrinjuck Woman of the Year

Roma Sinclair was named the Burrinjuck 'Woman of the Year' as part of the International Women's Day celebrations in the NSW Parliament House

The honour was recognition for a lifetime of service to the community of Grenfell including participation in many local community groups, including Rotary.

State MP for Burrinjuck Katrina Hodgkinson said "Roma Sinclair is an excellent role model for women and girls in Grenfell, having worked as a professional pharmacist full time until the age of 71, and is now, almost a decade later still helping out at the local pharmacy as a locum."

"Roma was also the first female member of the Grenfell Rotary Club and as well as holding the positions of President, Secretary and board member she has also served as a member of the Australian Rotary Health District Committee."

International Women's Day, which is held on 8 March every year, recognises the massive contribution made by women in all societies, in all walks of life, right across the globe.

this Award was Senior Constable Judith Crawford of Trundle nominated by Parkes Rotary.

Judith, from Junee, joined the NSW Police Force in 2002 and was one of the three State finalists receiving a Certificate from PDG Bernie. Her first posting was to Miranda in Sydney, then to Parramatta, Lightning Ridge and now Trundle for the past three years.

Features of all finalists were pride in their jobs, being conscious of the honour bestowed and the ability to express themselves eloquently and modestly when referring to loyal team members and commanding officers.

This was matched by the pride and pleasure of their colleagues, including Senior Police Officers present on the night.

This Awards project is very worthwhile and deserves widespread Rotary support because police do a tough job in our communities and recognition is rare.

Opening of Parkes Adventure Playground
