The satellite club supports the Rotary Community Corps of Alexandra that is made up of 15 volunteers from the Alex Men's Forum that primarily works to combat gender based violence. Although the RCC was certificated in 14<sup>th</sup> February 2020, logistical and lockdown restrictions only allowed for the presentation of the certificate and unveiling of a plaque displaying the Four Way Test in their meeting room, in November. The RCC has distributed toys, food, covid19 protection and other essentials procured by the Satellite Club to orphanages, old age





homes and other worthy recipients in Alex. It distributed food and disposable sanitary pads in Alex on Nelson Mandela Day. Members of the RCC also provide advice and guidence to the satellite club as to the relevance and feasility of envisaged projects. The RCC and the satellite club, in partnership with the Institute of Applied Alchemy, is pursuing a project to combat gender based violence in Alexandra.
