INVESTING IN PEACE IN AFRICA

Rotary is launching its first Rotary Peace Center in Africa — and Rotarians and others are asked help meet the goal of fully funding the new Makerere Peace Center in Kampala, Uganda.

The Makerere Rotary Peace Center will focus on peace and conflict transformation issues of particular relevance to Africa. The yearlong certificate program will emphasize hands-on peacebuilding experiences and will accept its first cohort of 20 Rotary Peace Fellows in early 2021.

The Certificate in Peacebuilding, Conflict Transformation, and Development program integrates theory, research, and skill building. Peace fellows will learn how initiate action to transform society through positive peace.

The program seeks qualified candidates from throughout Africa, with two cohorts of 20 Rotary Peace Fellows to participate in online and in-person learning each year. Coursework on human rights, governance, media,

and climate change will address the challenges of refugees, forced migration, and community cohesion.

Regional field study trips will complement curriculum-based Positive Peace workshops, conducted in partnership with the Institute for Economics and Peace. This coursework prepares fellows to return home for a nine-month period, during which they will implement a social change initiative that promotes peace within their workplace or community. The program concludes with the fellows returning to Makerere to report on their initiatives and impact.

SUPPORTING ROTARY'S FIRST PEACE CENTER IN AFRICA

The Rotary Foundation has set a goal of \$12 million to support peace fellowships at Makerere University, including tuition, fees, travel, and living expenses for the fellows. The funding will also support field experiences, workshops, and related educational and operational expenses.

Directed gifts will be used immediately to underwrite Rotary Peace Fellowships and other costs, while endowment gifts will secure the program's long-term future. Districts can contribute their District Designated Funds (DDF) toward both immediate expenditures and the Endowment. DDF given toward immediate expenditures qualifies for Peacebuilder District recognition, while DDF support for the Endowment helps meet the Peace Major Gifts Initiative goal.
