According to the WWW Foundation in 2020, only 47% of women have access to the internet in Namibia

In South Africa, an equivalent of one woman is killed every three hours (StatsSA, 2020)

Females in Angola were 34% less likely to have the same opportunities as males in the country (Statistica, 2021)

More than 3 600 teen pregnancies have been recorded in Namibia so far in 2021

South Africa's femicide rate is five times the global average

In 2019, Namibia recorded 200 cases of domestic violence per month (Borgen Project)

33.5% of women in Angolda aged 20-24 years were married before age 18 (UN Women, 2020) 2377 babies born 1 April – 1 Aug 2021 to girls aged 10 –19 (Hermanus)

SA - One in three girls aged between 10 and 19 years in South Africa fall pregnant and do not return to school, a presentation by the Department of Basic Education to Parliament has shown. (SEPT 2021)


Call to Action


What can we do?
