


Our dream is to have an all giving district meaning every penny towards this humble cause matters and we shall not tire until the dream comes to reality.



Can't wait to see you all at the Century 100th Discon in Jinja as we celebrate the District achievements. Don't forget let's begin the journey early and wrap up in November.



Globally, Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning are integral development practices that have been accepted in project implementation and management to facilitate evidence based decision, results tracking, learning and unlearning from services/products offered

Reflecting on how Rotaract clubs are operating especially in Uganda, there has been less appreciation and application of MEL practices in projects implemented making it harder or even impossible to always a quire real time data for decision making or tracing for facts on successful projects that were implemented over 20 years back.

The evolution of MEL reflects a growing sophistication in methodologies and tools, a deeper understanding of development complexities, and a stronger emphasis on using evidence for continuous improvement and accountability that need to be part of development initiative. As MEL pratices continue to evolve, they are likely to become even more integral to effective project management and sustainable development.


