
The Rotary Friendship Exchange Teams visited southwest India (Kerala, RID 3201), and southeast India (Tamil Nadu, RID 2981).

Food Plant Solutions Rotarian Action Group

- Approximately 5 children a minute, under the age of 5, die from malnutrition.
- 1 in 4 children under the age of 5 are affected with stunting.
- Malnutrition robs children of their futures and it is preventable.



The first 1000 days from conception are critical in a child's development. If children do not receive adequate quantities of key micro-nutrients during this period, they can be permanently damaged for life. This can include blindness, intellectual disabilities and impaired growth. Malnutrition robs children of their futures. This can be prevented.

One of the solutions to malnutrition is as simple as growing the right food plants in the right places.

The Food Plant Solutions project was designed to address malnutrition through the use of readily available and local food sources. With program partners, FPS encourages the establishment of demonstration food gardens in schools and communities, as these provide ongoing education and improve the health and nutrition of participants, who are provided with nutritious food prepared from these gardens.
