# Global Grant completed - Economic Development of Small Farmers in Joyabaj

Rotary Club of Milwaukee

Rotarians in the Rotary Club of Milwaukee and the Rotary Club of Guatemala Vista Hermosa recently completed a project and filed the final project report. The project worked to increase the economic capacity of small farmers in the Guatemalan highlands municipality of Joyabaj. The project provided agricultural training to diversify their crops, extend their growing season, and effectively grow cash crops in addition to their traditional subsistence crops. It also provided direct and safe access to the regional road network to get their crops to the Joyabaj market during the rainy season when rivers are high.

Cooperating organizations included Engineers without Borders at MOSE and Marquette Universities and Tenamaste. Chapters of Engineers Without Borders – USA (EWB) managed design, construction, and monitoring of two footbridges. Tenamaste provided expertise in regional and local solutions to agriculture training. This project was funded by Global Grant GG1527107.

# Global Grant completed – Implementation of e-Learning in 60 Rural Schools in RI District 2980

Elmbrook Rotary Club

Rotarians in the Rotary Club of Elmbrook working with Rotarians in District 2982 in India to implement a project to improve basic education and literacy for poor children studying in government and government-aided free elementary and middle schools in southeast India. The project was funded under Global Grant GG1527030. They worked to bring the accelerated learning technology to 60 free village schools in Rotary International District 2980. This provides similar opportunities to low income family children in rural areas that their counterparts have in urban and more upscale schools. Participants in southeast India included Rotary Clubs of Virudhachalam, Namakkal, Namakkal Poultry Town, Salem Cosmos, Chidambaram, Mayiladuthurai, Salem Metropolis, Kumbakonam Central, Nagapatinam, Salem Midtown, Attur, Salem Sunstar, and Sirkali. In undertaking this project, knowledge was sought from Parent -Teachers Associations and local Rotarians. Assistance was also received from RILM (Rotary India Literacy Mission), a national level literacy committee. The project has been certified as completed by The Rotary Foundation with the acceptance of the Final Project Report. Thank you to all who participated in this project.

### Rotary Friendship Exchange (RFE) to India

Members of the District 6270 Rotary Friendship Exchange (RFE) team leave in January to visit RID 2981 and RID 3201 in India. Members of the Indian teams joined us in Wisconsin in late May and early June of 2017 for our District Conference. ## **Polio**

### **End Polio Now - update**

As of December 28, there have been 19 new cases of polio reported in the world during 2017. Thus far this year

- Twelve cases have been reported in Afghanistan in 2017.
- Seven have been reported in Pakistan in 2017.
- There have been no new cases in Nigeria since August 21, 2016 16 months ago.

We are making great progress to End Polio Now. The count of new cases by recent year:

19 in 2017 (as of 12/28/17)	37 in 2016	74 in 2015	359 in 2014



Facts about Polio:

- Polio continues to paralyse children.
- Every child must be vaccinated to eradicate polio.
- We are over 99% of the way to eradicating polio globally.
- Polio eradication effort is the largest public-private partnership for public health. Thank you to every Rotarian and Club in District 6270 who has helped with this effort.
