He not only shared some valuable insights and discussion on the latest in membership he blessed us with an outstanding keynote at the Saturday night closing diner of the conference.

Ann Lee Hussey: She is truly one of the most respected and hardest working people I know with what she is doing to eradicate polio including going into areas most people refuse to ensure we finish the campaign to end Polio on top of being a Polio Survivor herself. To attest to what a blessing she is at the RI Convention in Atlanta with \$40,000 people they thanked and said they wouldn't be where they are without her. WOW were we blessed to have her speak at our walk at the Zoo on Saturday. Despite people having to huddle up under rain ponchos to have so many tell me that Ann Lee's speech will stick with them forever and be the most amazing speech they have ever heard in their life said it all. We are thankful for Ann having motivated our District to remember the importance of finishing the journey and to clubs like the Milwaukee Rotary Club that raised \$30,000 for Polio.
