The purpose of this funding request is to complement the funds that will be contributed by The Laredo Rotary Club (sponsoring club), 8 partnering Rotary clubs, and one non-profit organization to establish a library at Miguel F. Martinez Elementary School (MFMES) in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas (Mexico) to serve first through sixth grade students, since the school does not currently have this valuable resource. Also benefiting from the library will be the campus teachers, principal, who will receive professional development training on how to incorporate the library books into the teaching and learning experiences they provide their students. Parents will also benefit from the library, since they will also receive training on how ttto use library books to reinforce the instruction their children receive at school. The project is expected to last one year. Visual inspection of the campus by Rotarians Juan and Juanita Lira revealed that there is a desperate need for this facility.

Establishing and operationalizing this library is in keeping with The Rotary Foundation's Basic Education and Literacy Area of Focus. The library will help create a positive learning community that will involve knowledgeable educators and parents in a combined effort to enhance the teaching and learning experiences provided to the students. Richard L. Allington and Patricia M. Cunningham in their book Schools that Work (2007) clearly indicate that well-stocked school libraries are essential for providing students with multiple opportunities to acquire a deeper understanding of their lessons, explore topics that are of particular interest to them, and become avid readers.

The proposed initiative is designed to accomplish three objectives. Each objective and the strategies designed to achieve it are described below. Photos and other relevant materials will be maintained to accurately document the implementation of the various grant activities. Additionally, the grant and its accompanying activities will be widely publicized through print, electronic, and social media to inform local and global communities of this initiative. All relevant information and documentation will be included in the District Grant Final Report.

Objective 1: Establish a library at MFMES in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas (Tamps.) before the end of the fall 2015 semester.

Strategy for Achieving Objective 1 (Service projects undertaken by Rotarians are indicated with the capitalized words SERVICE PROJECTS).

With the \$7,000.00 pledged from various Rotary clubs and one non-profit organization, along with the \$5,000.00 requested from the District 5930 DDF Funds, \$10,000.00 will be used by Rotarians to purchase appropriate library books from the Follett Book Company in Mexico (SERVICE PROJECT) (the sole vetted source located that can provide the appropriate books in Spanish needed for this grant proposal). The books will reflect different topics, genres, and difficulty levels to help meet the needs of the students. Rotarians will pay \$1,480.00 to the parent of one of the students, who is a highly skilled carpenter, to purchase the materials and supplies needed to construct the bookshelves for the books. Rotarians will pay the remaining the \$520.00 to this parent for constructing the bookshelves and placing them in the designated space in MFMES. The books will be properly catalogued and include a library card in a pocket placed inside each book to facilitate the check-out and return of the books. Rotarians, the campus principal, and the teachers will collaborate to place the books on the shelves. (SERVANT PROJECT) A grand opening will subsequently be organized and held to announce to the community the opening of the library. This event will be widely publicized through print, electronic, and social media sources to inform local and global communities of this important development.

Objective #2: Enhance the literacy and learning environment at MFMES in Nuevo Laredo, Tamps.

Strategies for Achieving Objective 2: (Service projects undertaken by Rotarians are indicated with the capitalized words SERVICE PROJECTS).

Prior to the end of the fall 2015 term, Laredo Rotary Club members Juan Lira (PhD) and Juanita Lira (MS) (who are Professional Reading Specialists with extensive experience teaching students from elementary through university level) and Sandra Wirsching (PhD candidate with extensive experience teaching a variety of students) and other qualified Rotarians will conduct a needs assessment with the teachers and campus principal to determine their level of understanding of how to use library books to enrich the learning experiences for their students. (SERVICE PROJECT) The teachers and principal will also be asked to share their knowledge on how they could involve students' parents in an effort to support and enrich the literacy and learning experiences provided to their children.

Based on a careful examination of that information, Rotarians will develop and implement at least one professional staff development training session at MFMES prior to the end of the fall 2015 term for the teachers and principal. (SERVICE PROJECT) The session will focus on explaining and demonstrating how library books may be incorporated into the curriculum and instructional activities planned for the students. Subsequently, Rotarians will provide guidance, as appropriate, to the campus principal and teachers as they collaboratively plan how they can incorporate the concepts learned into the teaching and learning experiences planned for their students.

Rotarians will also inform the teachers that they will perform follow-up classroom visits to observe how the teachers are implementing the plans and to provide constructive feedback and suggestions, as appropriate. Rotarians will also organize and conduct at least one interactive session during which time the teachers and principal will share what they have learned, their impressions of the impact of the training they received, and recommendations for future sessions. (SERVICE PROJECT) This training experience is intended to help the campus principal and teachers develop the knowledge and skills needed to train new teachers that may join the staff in subsequent years and thus sustain this initiative.

Prior to the end of the spring 2016 term, Rotarians will collaborate with MFMES teachers and the camps principal to help them organize and hold a Literacy Celebration at the campus. (SERVICE PROJECT) Parents and community members will be invited to attend and listen to teachers explain how they have used library books to enhance the learning experiences for their students. Students from each grade will then demonstrate and explain how their interests in and knowledge about different topics have grown as a consequence of reading a variety of books and engaging in different activities involving the use of the books. For example, students could dress up as their favorite character in a book they read, prepare a poster of their favorite book, or construct a model of a vehicle they have read about and like. They could then explain why they made this selection.

In an effort to enhance students' motivation to read as many books as possible, the boy and girl from each grade who reads the most library books from the opening of the library until the end of April 2016 will be presented with a special certificate recognizing them as the King and Queen of the Library. This presentation will be made as part of the Literacy Celebration. Rotarians will help the teachers establish a simple process to maintain a record of the books read by each student and what they enjoyed most about the books. This evidence will the basis for selecting the King and Queen of the Library. (SERVICE PROJECT)

Rotarians will coordinate efforts with the campus principal and other individuals to notify newspapers and television stations of the Literacy Celebration to request that they have representatives on hand to cover this event and to disseminate it widely. Rotarians will also announce and document this event with photos on the Laredo Rotary Club and District 5930 websites, as well as different social media sources to inform all the participating entities, as well as local and global communities, of these accomplishments. (SERVICE PROJECT)

Objective #3: Enhance parents' knowledge and skills to help them reinforce and enrich the literacy experiences in which their children participate at MFMES.

Strategies for achieving Objective 3: (Service projects undertaken by Rotarians are indicated with the capitalized words SERVICE PROJECTS).

Prior to the end of January 2016, Rotarians will contact the leadership of the MFMES Parent-Teacher Council and request assistance in locating and recruiting students' parents to attend a meeting at the school. At the meeting, Rotarians will explain the project to the parents, as well as conduct a needs assessment with them, to determine their level of understanding of how they can create and maintain a print-rich literacy environment at home to support the literacy development of their children. (SERVICE PROJECT)

Based on a careful analysis of this information, Rotarians will develop and implement at least one professional staff development training session prior to the end of February 2016 for these parents. The session will focus on explaining and demonstrating how parents can support and encourage the development of their children's reading, writing, listening, and speaking through the use of library books and other materials. (SERVICE PROJECT) Parents will be asked to keep a simple entry log of the literacy events in which they participate with their children and their impressions of these experiences.

As part of this training session, Rotarians will describe the importance of reading in their professional and personal lives, as well as demonstrate some of their favorite books. Rotarians will also inform the parents that they will meet with students to share their favorite book(s), explain why they like the book(s), and elaborate on how avid reading has positively influenced their lives and helped them to help others. (SERVICE PROJECT) Parents will be able to refer to these Rotarians as role models who appreciate and value literacy.

Rotarians will meet with the parents at least once prior to the end of April 2016 to obtain their impressions of the training in which they have participated, their perceptions of the literacy experiences they have had with their children, and recommendations for future sessions. (SERVICE PROJECT) A representative group of parents will be invited to collaborate with campus educators to help educate new groups of parents on what they can do to enhance the literacy development of their children.

Community Assessment & Impact

Juan and Juanita Lira, members of the Laredo Rotary Club, have visually confirmed that MFMES does not currently have a library. Consequently, the establishment of this facility can have a profound impact on the academic success of current and future students attending this campus. For example, the library will serve the 210 first through sixth grade students attending this school and their six teachers. Additionally, at least 210 parents can profit from the training that will be provided by Rotarians to help them enhance the literacy development of their children. The training provided to the campus principal, teachers, and a team of parents is intended help them apply their knowledge and skills with different groups of children and parents in subsequent years. Thus, the impact of the library and the training will be farreaching.

Sustainability

To ensure the benefits of the library extend beyond the one year period of the grant, the campus administration has pledged that the library and its books will be properly maintained in order for this facility to operate effectively and efficiently. To achieve this end, the library will be appropriately staffed and secured to ensure that all the books are correctly catalogued and properly arranged on the bookshelves to facilitate access and check-out. In addition, the administration will work with the teachers to develop a suitable schedule to ensure that students and teachers will be able to visit the library and check-out books regularly and easily. The administration has also confirmed that books that become worn will be replaced with duplicate copies or new titles, as needed.
