Subj: Annual FY2011 Foundation Committee Report

Ref: (a) Rotary International District 5520 Bylaws Article 5.060 "District Rotary Foundation Committee"

1. Reference (a) requires an annual report to the membership of District 5520 on the prior year's District Rotary Foundation Committee activities no later than 90 days after the close of fiscal year.

2. Rotary District 5520 participated in the Ambassadorial Scholar program, the World Peace Fellow program, the Group Study Exchange program as well as the District Simplified and Matching Grant programs. Below is a summary of the use of D5520 District Designated Funds (DDF) during FY 2011.

Notes:

- (1) World Peace Fellow Zélie Pollon was funded by The Rotary Foundation’s World Fund.
- (2) The large ending balance was in anticipation of funding 3 Ambassadorial Scholarships (\$26,000 each) in FY2012.
- (3) Many D5520 clubs have committed to contribute to Global Grant 25527; while D5520 cannot “match” those contributions, D5520 transferred \$10,000 DDF to D5440 to assist with the grant.

3. The District Simplified Grant program funding consisted of \$29,618.00 of Restricted DDF from The Rotary Foundation and \$20,382.00 of D5520 funds; approximately \$2,895.00 of D5520 funds was unallocated; an additional \$2,000 was returned because the project was not able to be executed in the required time frame. All FY2011 District Simplified Grants have been satisfactorily completed and reported except for one. Below is a list of the completed projects:

Rotarian Ken Shaw of Kriegel/Gray/Shaw, P.C., Las Cruces, NM, conducted the required Independent Financial Review (IFR) on both Foundation and D5520-funded Simplified Grants. No deficiencies were noted. The Rotary Foundation has accepted D5520's final report on District Simplified Grant DS1172371 subject to submission on the required IFR which was submitted on September 29, 2011.

4. The Matching Grant program directly funded 22 projects with \$68,100.00 of District 5520 Designated Funds (DDF); the remaining project did not request D5520 matching DDF. Two of these matching grants were hosted by D5520 clubs – Albuquerque and Las Cruces-Mesilla Valley; four Matching Grants were put together by D5520 International Host clubs – Santa Fe Centro (MG1173262), Albuquerque Del Norte (MG1173317), Alamogordo (White Sands) (MG1173720) and El Paso Sunrise (MG1173996).



5. Ambassadorial Scholar Anna Claire Wadsworth was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Albuquerque. She has completed her Arabic studies at the American University of Beirut. Prior year Ambassadorial Scholar David John Edwards completed his studies and returned \$11,500.00 of unused funds from his \$25,000.00 Scholarship.

6. World Peace Fellow Zélie Pollon of Santa Fe completed her two-year Masters Level studies at the University of Bradford (UK) this spring.

7. Our Group Study Exchange team visited D9670 in Australia's New South Wales. The team was led by Tony Pino of the Albuquerque Del Sol Rotary Club. D9670 provided \$6,500 in DDF to cover half of the outbound GSE team's cost of \$13,000.
