**Ending Balance** 

1. Reference (a) requires an annual report to the membership of District 5520 on the prior year's District Rotary Foundation Committee activities no later than 90 days after the close of fiscal year.

2. Rotary District 5520 participated in the Ambassadorial Scholar program, the Group Study Exchange program as well as the District Simplified and Matching Grant programs. Below is a summary of the use of D5520 District Designated Funds (DDF) during FY 2012.

## Notes:

- (1) D5520's Outbound GSE Team was funded by The Rotary Foundation's World Fund.
- (2) The large beginning balance was in anticipation of funding 3 Ambassadorial Scholarships (\$26,000 each) in FY2012.
- (3) D4940 transferred \$1,325 to D5520 to enable us to provide the proper DDF match for their project.
- (4) D5170 transferred \$7,203 to D5520 for MG 77381 which was subsequently returned when the project was withdrawn.
- 3. The District Simplified Grant program funding consisted of \$24,502.00 of Restricted DDF from The Rotary Foundation and \$22,170.00 of D5520 funds (which included \$2,170 recouped from FY 2011); \$44.00 of D5520 funds was unallocated; an additional \$1,888.24 was returned because the projects were not able to be executed in the required time frame or project costs were less than anticipated. All FY2012 District Simplified Grants have been satisfactorily completed. Below is a list of the completed projects:

Rotarian Ken Shaw of Kriegel/Gray/Shaw, P.C., Las Cruces, NM, conducted an Independent Financial Review (IFR) on both Foundation and D5520-funded Simplified Grants. No deficiencies were noted. The Rotary Foundation has accepted D5520's final report on District Simplified Grant DS1274345.

4. The Matching Grant program funded 25 projects with \$62,325.00 of District 5520 Designated Funds (DDF). Four of these matching grants were hosted by D5520 clubs – Albuquerque, El Paso, El Paso Camino Real and West El Paso; three Matching Grants were put together by D5520 International Host clubs – Alamogordo (White Sands) (MG1275538), Albuquerque Del Norte (MG1275472), and Santa Fe Centro (MG\_\_77381).

- (4) MG1276863 was funded with \$3,000 D5520 DDF of which \$1,325 was provided by D4940.
- (5) MG\_\_77381 was to have been funded with \$9,203 D5520 DDF of which \$7,203 was to have been provided by D5170.
- 4. District 5520 had a record-setting year in Annual Program Fundraising in 2011-2012. Rotarians and clubs contributed \$292,236.76 or \$103.56 per Rotarian; this is District 5520's highest district per capita giving exceeding the previous high by \$9.58 and, in total giving, is second only to FY2008's \$295,559.59 (\$93.98 per capita). This year's giving was 143.59% of the district's \$203,515 goal; in fact, the 143.59% of goal was second among Zone 27 districts. All but six clubs contributed to the Annual Fund and 23 clubs averaged \$100 per person or greater. PDG Dick Jones' Choose Your Cruise incentive program resulted in \$108,820.00 for the Annual Program Fund. DRFC Tom Walker's one-time Paul Harris Fellowship matching program at the District Conference added another \$25,000.00 (over 50 Paul Harris Fellowships); this matching program was assisted by the Rotary Clubs of Albuquerque and Las Cruces (Rio Grande).

- 5. District 5520's clubs contributed \$57,646.97 to the Polio Plus campaign (see above). This brings our Polio Plus giving to \$206,988.17 which is very close to our goal of \$210,000. PDG Dick Jones' tireless work resulted in 100% of D5520 clubs contributing to Polio Plus. District 5520 also contributed \$15,000 DDF to Polio Plus bringing the District's DDF contribution to Polio Plus to \$45,000.
- 6. District 5520 clubs contributed \$113,970 to support the 25 Matching Grants (see above) which was matched by \$62,325 of District Designated Funds. Additionally, our members contributed \$14,679.69 to The Rotary Foundation's Permanent Fund (see above).
- 7. District 5520 members continue to support The Rotary Foundation through various giving programs; a summary of the support of these programs is provided below:

Ambassadorial Scholar Mackenzie Rachel Wehner was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Los Alamos. She has completed her Community Medicine studies at Cambridge University. Ambassadorial Scholar Sarita Fae Jarmack was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Rio Rancho and completed her Masters of Education at Aalborge University in Copenhagen, Denmark. HyJung Lee (MaryAnna) of D3590 South Korea was hosted by Norm Liss (Albuquerque Del Norte) while she attended the University of New Mexico to obtain her Masters in Teaching English as a Second Language.
- 9. Our Group Study Exchange team visited D9350 in South Africa April 10 May 7, 2012. The team was led by Julie Frendle of the Rotary Club of Albuquerque Del Sol. The team consisted of Heather Antonissen (Taos-Milagro), Christina Kreamer (Los Alamos), and Alysia Landry (San Juan County East); at the last minute Roland Snure (Silver City) wasn't able to participate . D5520 hosted the inbound GSE team from D9350 April 22 May 21, 2012. The Rotary Foundation's World Fund funded the outbound GSE team's cost of \$13,000.
