French Rotarians Meet with New Orleans Mayor

New Orleans Mayor Mitch Landrieu and a team of local business, tourism and culture and civic and government leaders traveled to France Monday (Nov. 27) to celebrate the historic ties between New Orleans and France. The trip was in conjunction with the city's Tricentennial celebration and will allow Landrieu and his team to explore opportunities for economic development

Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo and Orléans Mayor Olivier Carré invited Landrieu and his team to visit their respective cities, and Landrieu will work with both to discuss future economic partnerships. "This type of proactive international collaboration creates more peaceful, prosperous and resilient communities around the world," Landrieu said.

Landrieu arrived in France Monday and stayed through Thursday, during which time he met with various government officials, tour riverfront developments and attend a symposium on the history of New Orleans. On Tuesday, Nov. 28, Mayors Landrieu and Carre held a reception at the Orleans Town Hall. Orleans Rotarians Bernard Dubreuil and Michel Hugnot were in attendance.

Bernard reports "I went to this reception with Michel Hugnot, President 2018/2019, where we were able to present to the mayors of Orléans and New Orleans our common project. The atmosphere was warm; the two mayors expressed a real desire to strengthen relations between our two cities, including supporting the initiatives of associations. New Orleans staffer Emma Tyler told us that she would help us work with Rotary Clubs in New Orleans for the Tricentennial. This brief meeting with the delegation was an excellent starting point for enhanced collaboration between our Clubs."
