MUSIC, DRAMA AND DANCE

Youth volunteer their time to educate the community about the prevention of HIV while preserving their culture through songs, dance and plays.

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Active HOGU volunteers are eligible for high school scholarships. Evidence shows that the longer students stay in school, the greater their chance for healthy futures.

RESOURCE CENTER

Provides solar power for children to do their homework in the evenings and houses the first computer program in the village. Life skills camps and HIV testing take place here annually.

Boys and girls not only play soccer and volleyball but learn how to set goals, plan for the future and make positive choices. Sports clubs are a proven way to engage youth in healthy dialogue and provide them with social support.

Building Our School Brick By Brick

HOGU's founders created Twin Nursery and Primary School in January 2007. Despite being a small school built out of scraps of wood and cardboard, students are able to compete among the best and brightest on standardized tests and literacy competitions. This year's special project is focused on completing the construction of the school, brick by brick. The school began with 10 students and in just a few years has grown to include 1st-7th grades with 250 enrolled students. When HOGU volunteers complete High School, they are able to train to become teachers at Twin School, creating employment opportunities in the village! Our students have proven themselves; now it is our time to provide a secure, safe, healthy space for our children to come to school every day!
