Methodology

The enclosed list of non-profit organizations identifies best practices among AHT programs focused on the following four major impact areas:

- **Public Awareness** The FBI ranks San Diego 13 among cities in the U.S.
- Advocacy For the safety and wellbeing of at-risk populations.
- **Education** & **Prevention** For victims, children, adolescents, students, parents, and teachers.
- **Victim Support** Front-line organizations, safety, housing, food, counseling, and mental health.

Vetting Process

We performed due diligence on each organization to ensure they are actively and transparently performing charitable work in district area and meet 501c3 requirements. We believe each of these organizations is having a positive impact on our community. We kept the list to local organizations, and we used the following criteria to review each of them:

- **History:** We list the year the organization was established, reviewed how long the organization has been in operation and researched local partners. We identify endorsements from locally known leaders when available.
- **Financial Statements:** Each nonprofit organization is a public 501(c)3 nonprofit and has an EIN.
- **Program Impact:** We show programmatic results when available.
- News/Current Activities Search: We used search engines to look for recent articles regarding
 the charities' current activities. We searched the Founders/Executive Director's name and
 make sure there is no adverse information.
- **Online and Social Media Presence:** We checked their website and activity on social medial platforms.
- Reviewed by the San Diego Trafficking Prevention Collective: This group is organized by UBS Financial Services and develops collaboration between non-profit organizations to build sustainable, effective, and sufficient outcomes.
- **Approved of the San Diego District Attorney's Office:** As a final step, we sent our list for review and endorsement of the law enforcement team locally involved in anti-human trafficking.
