During Session 2 -- 10:10am -- **Millions for HOPE** -- training for M4H Advocates; open to anyone who is interested in learning more about this important and exciting district initiative

During Session 3 -- 11:10am -- **District Grant Management** -- a how-to course for any club which may want to sponsor a Rotary DISTRICT Grant next year -- open to anyone who wants to know what Rotary District Grants are all about

ALL THE ABOVE SESSIONS require registration on the district website for the 2015 District Training Assembly.

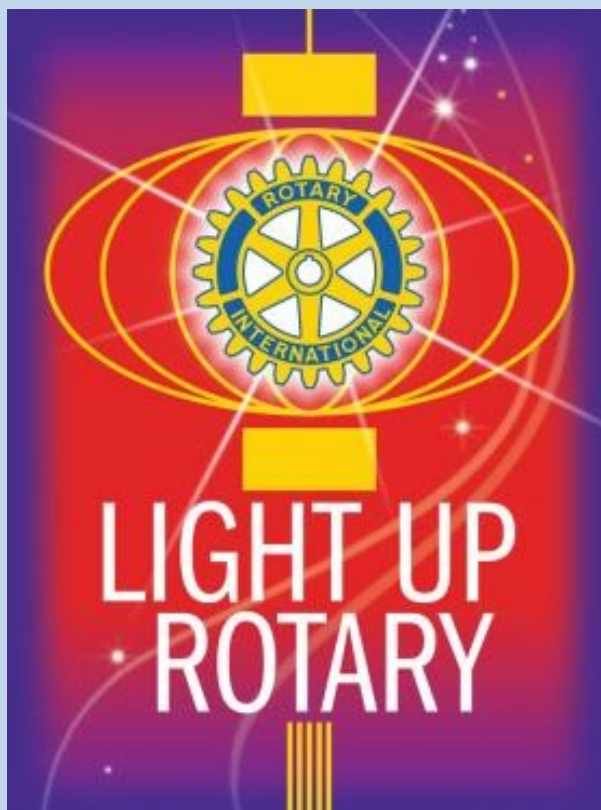

Making a BIG Difference in the Dominican Republic

During the week of February 21-28, twelve **Encinitas Coastal Rotarians** and family members along with seven Pennsylvania Rotarians made a BIG difference in the Dominican Republic. Thanks to a District Grant and the generous contributions of the participants and their clubs, they sponsored a mobile health clinic, painted bathrooms in a health care facility, funded and helped build roofs for latrines, painted a community center/church and a couple of houses, funded an internet library in a school, attended a microfiber water filter training and a distribution event, and escrowed funds along with the local Rotary Club to purchase a lot and build a community playground.

How did all this happen? District 7330 (in Pennsylvania) has been regularly supporting this area for several years. One of their members moved to California recently and joined the **Encinitas Coastal Rotary Club**. The members of the **Encinitas Coastal Rotary Club** have loved project travel on many occasions (Honduras, Belize, Nicaragua and others) so it didn't take long to convince them they would enjoy serving the people of the Dominican Republic. It is just another creative use of a Rotary District Grant and Rotarians living out the motto of “Service above Self”.
