

Developing Catalysts For Peace

Peace Fellowships

All of Rotary's Six Areas of Focus contribute to global efforts toward peace. For example, water and sanitation programs help alleviate some of the underlying roots of population migrations leading to conflict. But the specific area of Peace and Conflict Resolution is often overlooked. Out of \$86.7 million dollars awarded by The Rotary Foundation (TRF) in, only \$ 3.5 million went to Peace and Conflict Resolution.


The most important way that Rotary helps to alleviate conflict is through its support of Peace Fellowships for select individuals to attend one of six Peace Centers around the world: Sweden, England, North Carolina, Thailand, Japan and Australia. And starting in 2020-21 a new center will open in Uganda.



According to Rotary, "each year, Rotary awards up to 100 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders to study at one of these centers. Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the fellows into experienced and effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

In just over a decade, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,200 fellows. Many of them now serve as leaders at international organizations or have started their own foundations."

While studying peace and conflict may at first seem like a theoretical, academic exercise, graduates put their new expertise to good practical use. For

example, a Philadelphia police officer recently attended the Peace Center in Thailand and returned home to help his fellow officers build better community relations as well as detect and address human trafficking.

If you know someone who might benefit from Rotary's Peace Fellowship program please urge them to apply. Rotary asks that candidates have the following attributes:

- Proficiency in English; a second language is strongly recommended
- Demonstrated commitment to international understanding and peace
- Excellent leadership skills
- Master's degree applicants: minimum three years of related full-time work or volunteer experience, bachelor's degree
- Certificate applicants: minimum five years of related full-time work or volunteer experience

Looking ahead to 2020-21, all current Presidents Elect and Presidents Nominee need current training!



Value of Rotary Volunteering

A special report prepared for Rotary International by the Johns Hopkins Center for Civil Society Studies estimates the value of Rotary member volunteer hours at \$850 million a year. The report gives a conservative estimate of nearly 47 million hours of volunteer effort generated by Rotary members in a typical year. The report recognizes that volunteer service is not only a feel-good calling —it may provide one of the more promising, and one of the more fulfilling—avenues through which to achieve the ambitious goals that the international community has set for itself.
