District 5190's Speech Contest Teller's Instructions

This year's theme for our speech contest:
"Making Connections as We Create Lasting Change"

- Contestants receive a point score of:
 - 30 for First Place
 - 20 for Second Place
 - 10 for Third Place
- Record the point scored by each judge for each contestant. (30, 20 or 10)
- Total the scores for each contestant.
- Subtract timekeeper's penalties, if any.
- Calculate the judges' total placement score.
- If there is a tie, use the tiebreaker ballot to determine the winner.
 - Example: If contestants 1 & 2 both score the highest @ 100 points each, the one that places highest on the tiebreaker ballot wins, and the other comes in second.
- Sign the sheet at the bottom and give to the Master of Ceremonies.

Keep all copies of judges scores. Under no circumstances are the judges' scored sheets or your tally sheet to be shown to contestants, coaches or parents. Thank you for helping us today.

District 5190's Speech Contest Timekeeper's Instructions

1. On the sheet below, record the minutes and seconds each speaker lasts. Begin timing after the speaker has addressed the audience and stated the title of his or her speech. If the contestant begins without addressing the audience or stating the title, begin timing immediately. After each speech ends, time one minute for the judges to complete their score sheets. No talking by the audience during this minute.
2. After recording the time, calculate the number of penalty points. Speeches are limited to a minimum of five minutes and a maximum of seven minutes.
Participants lose 3 points for each minute or fraction thereof under 5 or over 7 minutes. Enter zero (0) if there is no time penalty.

Example: If a contestant's time is 8:05, the contestant has a penalty of 6 points, 3 points for the minute over and 3 points for the additional fraction of a minute over the limit.

3. Turn this sheet in to the teller after the last contestant has spoken.
