- The District has a reputation for supporting exchanges. Contact the District International Service Chair.

• WHAT IS THE PROCEDURE?

- The District RFE Chair communicates with a potential District.
- Once the district is chosen to partner with, word goes out to clubs seeking participants.
- At the chosen date the team lands in the host country and from here is hosted by local Rotarians.
- Team members stay in Rotarian's homes. So the lodging and home meals are covered.
- The guests are responsible for restaurant and other out of home expenses.
- Several communities are visited, the hosts show their guest local points of interest.
