Please be aware that the seminar requirement must be met each year.

WHY GRANTS?

District Grants are available for clubs to use on new and existing projects. At the Nov 1st Foundation Brunch, we learned how the grants have made projects possible for several clubs.



Mark Matt of DeWitt Rotary shared how he utilized a grant, plus funds from multiple clubs, to raise over \$8,000 needed to provide cold storage units for the new Samaritan Center; which feeds the needy in Syracuse every day of the year.

Tom Collins of Moravia Rotary explained how his club teamed up with the owners of Southern Tier Stables to raise \$7,500 and get an additional \$2,500 from district grant to provide the money needed for a special lift. The lift will help the handicapped to get on a horse for therapy sessions and will make it possible for adults, like disabled veterans, to utilize this unique and effective therapy option!
