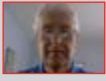

Are you ready to serve your fellow Rotarians by providing them with the training and resources to grow their clubs and increase their impact?













THE DISTRICT 7150 LEGACY PROJECT FUND FAQ'S

How many Legacy Project Grants will be awarded?

There will be at least five, but probably more. Clubs are encouraged to think big and submit proposals for any amount up to \$10,000. We will award grants until the \$50,000 fund balance is depleted.

Can clubs join together and submit a joint proposal?

Absolutely! We encourage club leadership to reach out to neighboring clubs in support of one project. Keep in mind:

- Grants will be limited to \$10,000 per project, so even a multiple-club proposal can be for no more than \$10,000
- Clubs may submit only one grant proposal, including multiple club projects.
- One contact person per project is required, even for those with multiple clubs participating

Do these Legacy projects have to be new initiatives?

The Legacy Fund will support both new and existing projects.

Where is the money coming from?

The fund is supplied by the reserves of District 7150. In recent years, district leadership has made changes that have had positive financial impact. For example, the cost of committee meetings and training via Zoom is far less than district-wide in-person gatherings. We have also saved printing costs as our online functionality has improved. In response to many Rotarians across the district, we have developed budgets for our district conferences with a keen eye on costs. Current district leadership is promoting the use of the surplus generated to serve the local communities of District 7150 before we join to form CNY Rotary in July, 2024.

Could our club support an international project with a Legacy Grant?

No, the Legacy Project Fund will support projects that address a documented need in the local community(ies) served by the club.

Could the application deadline of September 15, 2023 be extended?

NO!!! Because of our transition to CNY Rotary, we have set up the timeline to give clubs adequate time to plan their projects, execute them, and submit all expenses for reimbursement. Grant Funding Timeline:

- Applications accepted - July 1, 2023 to September 15, 2023
- Awards announced - October 1, 2023
- All funded expenses incurred and reported by June 1, 2024
- All funds disbursed by June 30, 2024

CREATING A CULTURE OF CARE from Rotary's Membership Minute

Rotary International

This year, RI President Gordon McInally is encouraging Rotary members to create a culture of care, both within Rotary and around the world, by making mental health a priority. In a caring culture, leaders and members focus on helping each other thrive.

That makes August **Membership and New Club Development Month** – the perfect time to evaluate your club's culture and adjust if needed. Members are more likely to stay if their club experience is fulfilling. Use these ideas to help members feel involved, valued and cared for:

- Communicate with people at every stage of their membership. If members think their experience in the club can be improved, take action to make changes. You can also use these two surveys to learn more about what members are thinking – the [member interest survey](#) will help you understand what new and prospective members care about and how they want to contribute, and the [member satisfaction survey](#) (or an [online version](#)) can be distributed each year to all members. By asking for feedback regularly and responding to it, you show that you're open to change, and you empower members to be involved in creating their ideal club experience.
- Use the [Club Health Check](#) to identify areas where your club could improve and determine how to keep your club relevant for members and the community.
- Take the [Creating an Inclusive Club Culture](#) course to discover ways for your club to become more inclusive, diverse and equitable. Remember that for any Learning Center course, you'll need a My Rotary account.

Recent Rotary research confirms that the club experience is what matters most to our members. So how do we take intentional action to make that club experience a great one? WE NEED TO KNOW WHO IS LEADING YOUR CLUB

D7150 Leadership

Each year our clubs have a turnover of leadership. Sometimes secretaries or treasurers stay on for multiple years, while presidents are almost always refreshed each July.

How are you communicating to the district and Rotary International who is leading your club and why does that matter? It's important to put your club's executive team into ClubRunner's database each year so that the people who support your club leaders can communicate with them. When you put this information into ClubRunner, it is automatically communicated to Rotary International too. This is a task that your club president or secretary will have the access to do and you can [click here](#) for step-by-step instructions on how to do it.

Every club should have at least their main club leadership identified (President, Secretary, Treasurer and President Elect), but you can input all kinds of titles to tell us who is serving as your Public Image Chair, Foundation Chair, Membership Chair, Youth Exchange Officer and more.

It's a very easy tool to use once you access it, but if you hit any roadblocks (like logging in), you can always reach out to our district secretary Peter Cardamone for support at peterf7150@gmail.com.

We ask that all clubs check and be sure their club's executive team is current and accurate in ClubRunner as soon as possible. Thank you for all you do to put service above self! ♦

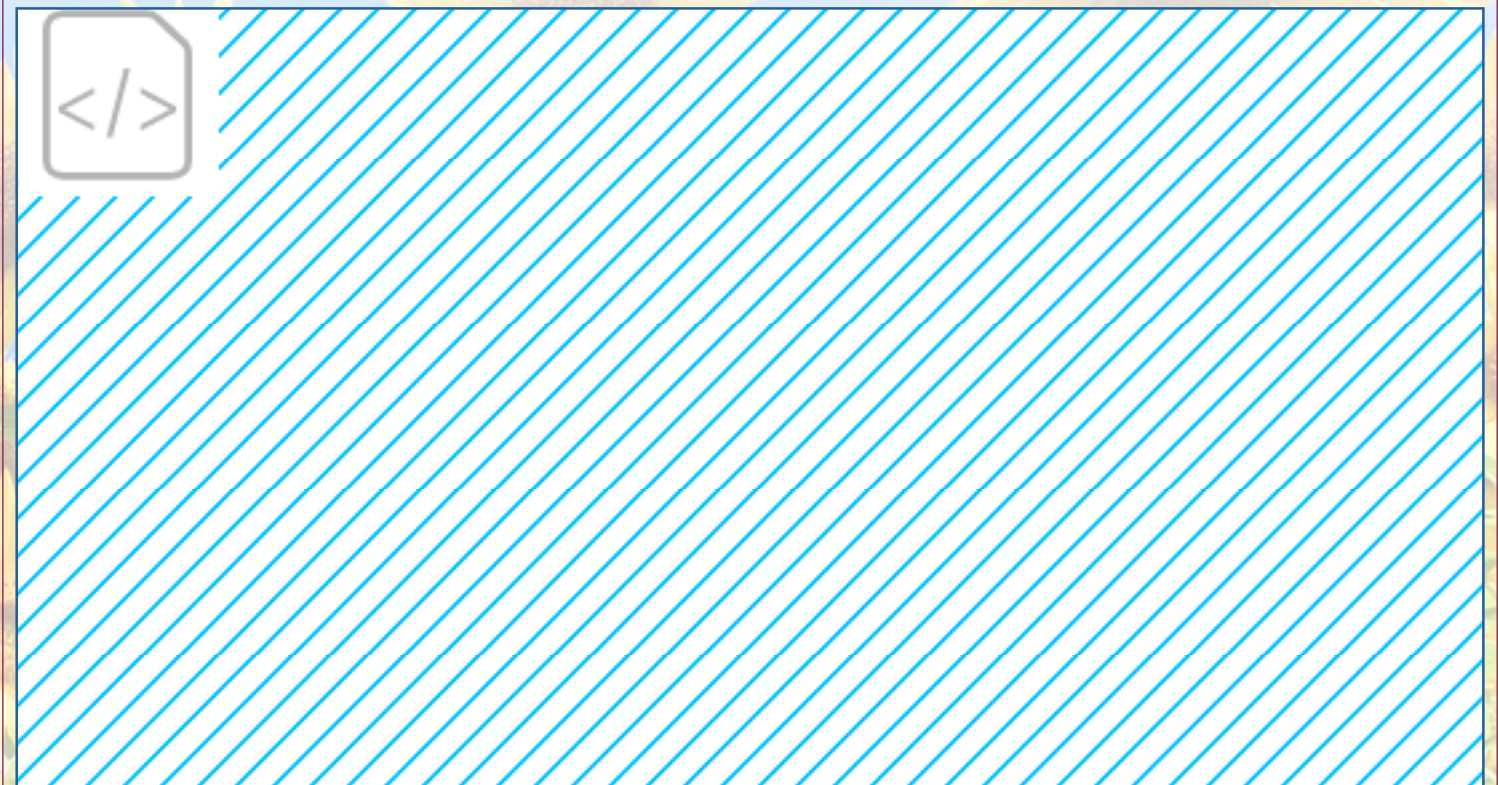
