NEW CONSENT FORM ON DISTRICT REGISTRATION FORMS

While registering for the District Conference Celebration or the Foundation Gala online, you may have noticed a new box that you need to check asking for permission for Rotary to use your guest's information. Please do not be alarmed! The data is not stored anywhere and their information will not be shared anywhere. This extra transparency is a result of the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) taking effect in the European Union. The new law forces people doing business on the internet to be crystal clear about how someone's data is being stored. It is a new consumer protection that potentially could impact a ClubRunner user living in the EU, so they added the check box to be in compliance. It changes nothing about we handle data and communications as they relate to district event registration. If you have further questions or concerns, please contact Lizzy!


NEW ROTARY THEME ANNOUNCED


