Please be aware that the seminar requirement must be met each year.

HEY YOU! SET YOUR GOALS!

It was the responsibility of each club president to set goals in My Rotary for their club's foundation giving. If you did not set them, you will receive a notification that they have been set for you. You can still go in and change them. Here's how:

HOW TO ENTER FOUNDATION GOALS

Rotary Club Central is the tool for clubs to input their foundation foals and to track their contribution progress.

1. Go to <u>www.rotary.org</u> and log in to My Rotary with your email address and password.

Click "Forgot Password" if you need to retrieve your credentials and they will email you the information you need to log in.

2. Once logged in, click on *Manage* and proceed to *Club and District Administration*. Under *Club Activity* you find **Rotary Club Central**.

3. Along the top you will see three tabs: Your Club, Service, and Foundation Giving. Click the **Foundation Giving** tab.

4. You will first see a trend graph for annual giving. Scroll down to the **Goals and Progress** section.

5. You should see three tabs labeled with last year's, this year's and next year's dates. This year's date (2015-16) should be already selected. Click **Edit** to enter your club's data.

Polio Update

Use these latest stats and news tips to tell your family, friends, coworkers and fellow Rotarians all about the fight against Polio!

- As of December 18th there were only 66 new cases of the wild polio virus
- That is a 79% reduction in cases from 2014
- All cases were confined to just two countries Afghanistan & Pakistan
- 430 million children remain at risk for contracting polio – hence the need for a big push for vaccinations, even as we get so close to eliminating the disease
- In 2015, the continent of Africa celebrated an entire year without any new cases of wild polio virus after Nigeria was removed from the list of endemic countries by the World Health Organization (WHO)
- US Congress approved \$268 million in the 2016 federal budget to help fight polio

Foundation Giving Needs to Grow

WHY GIVE TO THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION? BECAUSE WE GET THE MONEY BACK!

We have to wait three years, but we will get funds returned to the district based on how much was donated from members in our district. Clubs can then apply for a District Grant to use the money for a scholarship, to fund a new program, or to grow an existing program. (You MUST attend the grants workshop on Jan 23rd to be eligible to apply! See pg. 3)

WE CAN ONLY REAP WHAT WE SOW!

In this graph you can see how giving has resulted in tens of thousands of dollars coming back to the district for us to use in the coming years. However, we are lagging behind in this year's giving, which impacts how much we will have access to in 2018-2019.

USE ROTARY DIRECT


