- Resolutions proposed for the Council on Resolutions must be received by Rotary International by June 30, 2017.
- Legislation proposed for the 2019 Council on Legislation must be received by Rotary International by December 31, 2017.

# UPDATE MEMBER DATABASE FOR ACCURATE BILLING

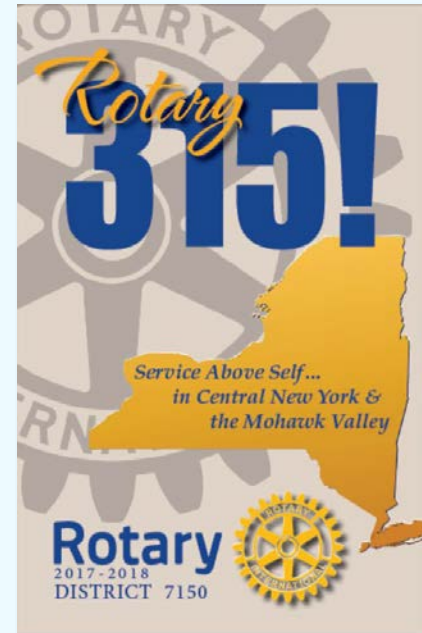
Just a friendly reminder to club presidents and secretaries to get your club's membership data updated before June 30th in order to ensure accurate billing from the district and Rotary International. The amount your a billed for dues is based on the number of members in the system and bills cannot be edited if the number is inaccurate.

***Your database must be updated in ClubRunner, which will communicate to Rotary International. It's important that your information is accurate in ClubRunner because this is what the district uses for communications, billing and much more.***

To access ClubRunner, a club president or secretary must go to [www.rotary7150.org](http://www.rotary7150.org), log into the Member Area (found in the upper right corner) and then edit their club's membership list in the Membership tab. Training for this is provided through programs like President Elect Training Seminars (PETS) and PRE-PETS, and District Training Assembly (DTA).
