#### RYLA APPLICATIONS DUE

This year's Rotary Youth Leadership Awards weekend will be July 8 - 10. Has your club chosen to sponsor a student (or two) for this fun and rewarding leadership program? Please note that the price is now \$325 per student.

If you want to make sure a student from your club's community gets to have this experience you will need to make sure your application is submitted by May 20th. Applications are available on the district web site and should be distributed in the schools, usually in conjunction with a guidance counselor. Students must fill out the application completely, including the essay, and clubs should be interviewing the kids during the selection process. That means you need to get started now if you haven't already!

### COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION MAKES BIG CHANGES

Every few years Rotarians review the "rules of Rotary" to determine what changes are needed. This year's Council on Legislation will go down in history as the most progressive, with many changes intended to make Rotary more accessible, forward-thinking and high tech. Changes include more flexibility for clubs with meeting times and locations, the ability for Rotaractors to become Rotarians, a small annual increase in dues for a few years to cover costs of new technology, clubs can no longer charge admission fees and there will no longer be a distinction for e-clubs being online clubs.
