SHOW A VIDEO:



She has taken it upon herself to take all the official languages of Switzerland in school (plus Spanish) to fully immerse herself in being Swiss. Additionally, she has taken an optional theatre class and helped expand their program. The theatre program will be writing and staring in their own plays centered on the theme "the first time."

In addition to her academic achievements, she has also been helping volunteer with Rotary. Not only does she attend her Rotary club meetings monthly but has also been an active advocate for Switzerland's youth exchange program.

In the beginning of November, she attended a national Rotary conference where she spoke on her experience thus far as an exchange student in Switzerland and what exchange has meant to her.
