ASSISTANT GOVERNOR

The role of the Assistant Governor (AG) is to support and strengthen clubs in your area. AG's are part of the district leadership team, with the responsibility to focus on becoming familiar with each club in your area. AG's have continual and meaningful contact with club leaders, regularly attend club meetings, and identify resources that will support club needs. Assistant Governors in the district collaborate to share ideas and strategies on how best to support all the clubs in the district.

LITERACY

CHITTENANGO & CLEAR PATH

It took a jumbo pair of scissors, but finally the ribbon cutting and dedication of the Art House/Wood Shop at Clear Path 4 Vets has been completed! The "Wood Shop" Project began during Ron Dean's 2014-15 club presidency. In 2014, the Club chose to honor Ned Mann, a former Marine and Rotarian, by dedicating the project to him just prior to his passing. The plaque reads "Select Woodworking Machines for Clear Path for Veterans Dedicated to the Vision of Ned Mann for service to his Country, USMC, and for his dedication to his community as President and Rotary District Governor." Last Thursday, Ned's wife Cindy assisted with the ribbon cutting and the official dedication. Ron, the project leader and a veteran himself, became incurably passionate about the organization. Over time, it became apparent that Clear Path would either have to hire him, or charge him with trespassing/stalking. We think that
