QUALIFICATIONS & PREREQUISITES

- Club President-Elect *and* Grant Chair are required to attend Grant Management Seminar. (If Grant Chair stays in that club office he/she need only attend training once every three years).
- Club President *and* President-Elect are required to sign The Rotary Foundation Club Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) AND Club the District 6420 Addendum to the RI MOU.
- Both of the MOUs listed above are to be mailed or emailed to the District Subcommittee Grant Chair:

- Application for Global Grants may be made any time during the Rotary year.
- Club must be current on reporting for any and all of your open and completed grants.
- Your club's yearly goals have been entered into Rotary Club Central at www.Rotary.org.
- A Host Partner is required in the host country.
- The Host Partner club and International partner must also be currently qualified.

D-6420 GLOBAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS

Global Grants are available only online through www.rotary.org. Clubs may apply for these any time during the year. Be sure to notify the District Foundation Chair, Ruth Lee, if your club is planning a Global Grant.

1. Project must result in a minimum Rotary Foundation (TRF) match of \$15,000, i.e. a \$30,000 project. This is based on TRF match of \$.50/\$1 to Rotary Club cash and \$1/\$1 match to District Designated Funds (DDF) to add up to your project total amount.
2. Have a Host Rotary Club and their primary contacts or District Partner in the district where the project will be implemented.
3. The project must fall within one or more of the 6 Rotary International areas of focus:
 - a. Peace & Conflict Resolution
 - b. Disease Prevention & Treatment
 - c. Water & Sanitation
 - d. Maternal and Child Health
 - e. Basic Education & Literacy
 - f. Economic & Community Development
4. The project must reflect the needs and wishes of the receiving community (Determined by a needs assessment).
5. Required to work with a D-6420 Grant Subcommittee which is the District Grants Chair, the District Foundation Chair and the District Governor. Use the Global Grant Consultant, Jane Goetz, as a mentor through the Global Grant application process. Requests for D-6420 funds must be made before the application is submitted.
6. Designate a club committee of at least 3 Rotarians to be the International Partner on the grant and who will serve as project contacts and accept reporting responsibility.

D-6420 APPLICATION PROCESS

Global Grant applications are completed ONLINE only via Rotary International website.

1. Log into www.rotary.org under MY ROTARY using your email address and password.
2. Select THE ROTARY FOUNDATION and then from the drop down menu select APPLY FOR GRANT.
3. Select APPLY FOR GRANT then fill in GLOBAL GRANT and a new application will open.
4. Many resources are available online from the Rotary website for writing grants. PLUS the D-6420 Global Grant Consultant is available to help with the process.
5. The D-6420 Grant Subcommittee will review the application before submission.
6. Global Grants require electronic approvals from Host Club, International Partner, AND from both district Foundation Chairs and both District Governors if district dollars are contributed.
7. After all required signatories are complete, the grant application can be submitted to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) for approval or possible corrections before approval.

D-6420 FUNDING GUIDELINES

- The District Grant Subcommittee determines how much District Designated Funds (DDF) may be applied to a Global Grant. DDF will vary from year to year depending on the District Annual Fund Foundation giving from three years before.
- Clubs can partner with other qualified clubs and/or qualified districts to increase cash and DDF available for a project.
- TRF will match club contributions at a ratio of \$.50: \$1.00.
- TRF will match DDF contributions at a ratio of \$1.00: \$1.00.
- The minimum match required by TRF is \$15,000 USD up to \$200,000. Additional levels of competition and TRF approval apply beyond a TRF award of \$50,000.
- Make sure to review the Global Grant information on the Rotary website.
