There is a lot going on in District 5180 with important dates and details for your club to remember to finish this current Rotary year and get ready for the next. Let's keep up to date.

Current Year Giving

Attached is the February "Tally Sheet" for this year's Million \$\$\$\$ Challenge. For our End Polio Now Campaign our giving to date total is \$92,452. With the District giving \$30,000 towards polio with their District Designated Funds, The Rotary foundation matching this amount with \$.50 on the dollar, and the Gates Foundation matching that 2 to 1, our donations that raised in excess of \$550,000 towards the eradication of polio this year. Thank you to Polio Plus Chair Bill Tobin and the Rotary Clubs of District 5180.

Our Annual Giving, which are the funds to come back to the District for our annual projects is \$184,508 through February. This compares to \$211,622. Our per capita is down over \$13 per member in the district. We have done such a good job in our polio contributions that we have fallen behind in our annual contributions. We still have 3 months to reach our goals so let's let our members know that we cannot help alleviate hunger, provide water and sanitation, and make the world a better place without contributions to the Foundation.

Congratulations to the Rotary Clubs of Fair Oaks and Point West for attaining over 100% average in the goals set for them.

Endowed Scholarships

The District has a \$30,000 John Cole Endowed Scholarship available for the coming school year for a student who wants to pursue their graduate degree abroad during the coming Rotary year. The District also has an endowed scholarship available for a student from a country outside the United States who would like to pursue a graduate degree at a university in the greater Sacramento area in one of the six areas of focus of The Rotary Foundation. District Grant Projects

The time is fast approaching for clubs to submit their District Grant applications for the projects you would like to use Foundation \$\$\$ for on next year's projects. The criteria and dollar requirements have not changed since last year and the deadline for submitting your applications will be May 1, 2017. All details and requirements for submitting a grant application can be seen on the District website at <http://rotary5180.org/SitePage/district-grants>. Remember, in order to qualify for a District Grant or for that matter a Global Grant in the 2017-18 Rotary year, a member of your club must go through Grant Management Training (See Below)!!!!

Grant Management Certification

In order to be certified by the District to be qualified to participate in Rotary Grant Projects (District and Global) a club has to go through

the District's Grant Management Certification Training each year. As discussed with the presidents elect at their PrePETS, it is our District's goal to do this training in a webinar format this year. Each club that would like to receive either a District or Global grant during the 2017-18 Rotary year must send one member of their club through the training. This training will be done in three 30 minute plus or minus webinars that the District committee is working on at this time. The following are the details of the District Grant Management Training:

1. There will be three 30 minute plus or minus webinars in which one member of every club participates. That member must participate in all three webinars.
2. The webinars will be conducted twice in one week so to give each person participating in the certification an opportunity to not have to develop a schedule that conflicts with other activities.
3. These webinars are tentatively scheduled for the first three weeks of May 2017 allowing for time to fully develop the webinars. Details will be given at the District Training Assembly on April 1.
4. After the second webinar is finished in each week, a test will be sent to each participant in both seminars which must be returned within 24 hours. These test will be used as the attendance records to determine that each club that wants certification has in fact attended the training.
5. Once the grant management training is completed and clubs become certified, the President and President Elect can sign the memorandum of understanding that is required by The Rotary Foundation for participation in the Grant process.

Further details will be outlined in all of the Foundation and Grant training sessions at the District Training Assembly on April 1, 2017.
