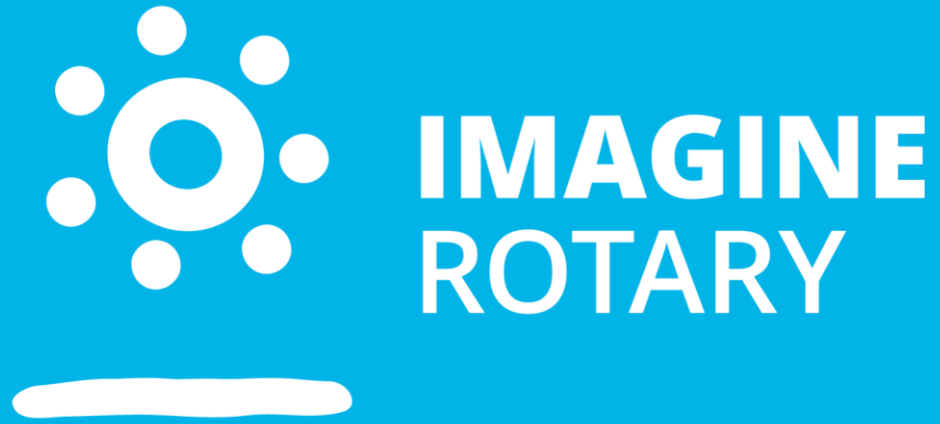

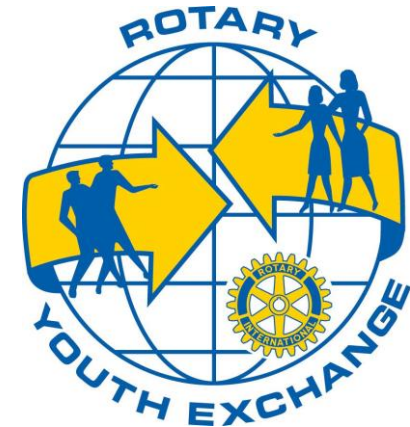

YOUTH EXCHANGE

- Students become global citizens; Youth aged 15-19 sponsored by clubs in 100+ countries
- Attend local schools for and live with multiple host families for up to 1 academic year
- Room, board and school fees are covered
- Students are typically responsible for:
 - Round trip airfare
 - Travel insurance
 - Travel documents (passports and visas)
 - Spending money and any additional expenses (travel, tours, etc.)
- Current year – 3 outbound and 2 inbound from France and Denmark
- 2 applications have been received to date with further updates to come in March
- Partnered with D7010 for orientations, information sessions and events for students

ROTARACT

- Rotaract brings people who are 18+ together
- “Rotaract” = Rotary in Action
- Rotaract clubs can now be independent without a sponsoring Rotary Club as of July 1, 2020
- Clubs can but are not required to establish an upper age limit
- 80 Rotaractors in D7070 and 202 000 + worldwide
- New clubs forming: Humber College and Richmond Hill

INTERACT



- Youth ages 12-18; almost 343 000 Interactors worldwide in 145 countries
- 21 Active clubs that are community and school based (COVID-19 disruptions)
- Focus on developing leadership, project management team building and resume building skills
- Complete community volunteer hours, give back to community, develop friendships

RYLS (ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP SYMPOSIUM)

- RYLS (formerly RYLA) gathers youth ranging from ages 17 to 23 for an immersive program focused on diversity, leadership, and action.
- RYLS is taking place this May 11-14 2023 at the Ganaraska Forest Centre, an outdoor education facility; 34 students are taken part
- The 3-night experience will offer an inspiring program: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, Reconciliation and Land Based Education, Hands-on Activities, Group Dynamics, Outdoor Survival and GPS Geocache adventures along with campfires, friendship, fun and learning
- Rotary Clubs were encouraged to sponsor eligible participants within their community, as well as members of the Rotaract and Interact Clubs

YOUTH TO YOUTH (Y2Y)

SPONSORED BY HIP (HONOURING INDIGENOUS PEOPLES)

- Organizing Canada-wide youth-to-youth engagement activity
- Outdoor activities at a camp in Manitoba near Winnipeg; for 4 days
- Human Rights Museum in Winnipeg is very supportive of this event and will sponsor a one-day education session
- Currently seeking 25 Indigenous students and 25 non-Indigenous students
- 12 applications received to date
- Fall event 2022 was cancelled in 2022; a strong sense of enthusiasm as we move past some of the restrictions of COVID-19
